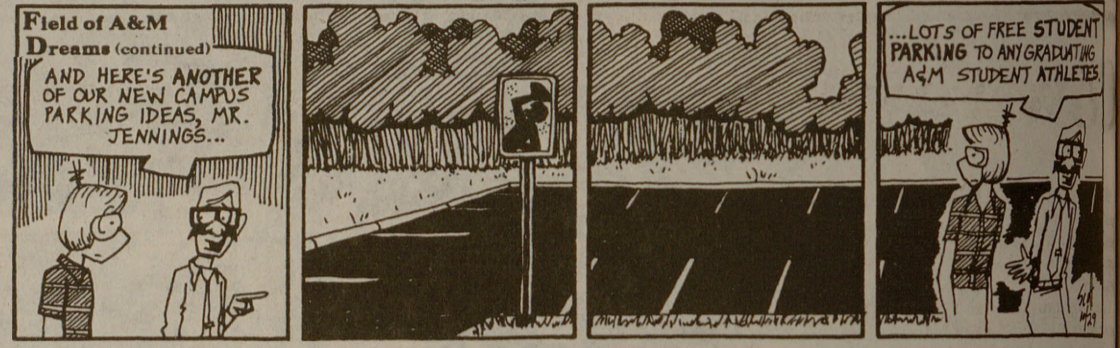

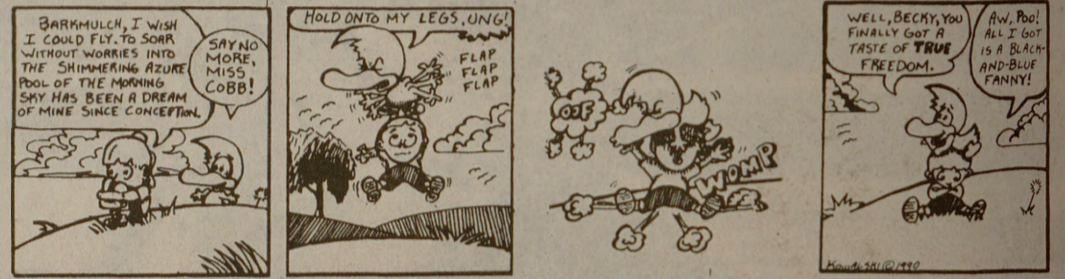

Iraq cancels gasoline rationing, embargo's success questioned

In a surprise move, Iraq said Sunday it is halting gasoline rationing imposed earlier in response to global economic sanctions. The Soviets said their latest diplomatic effort to settle the Persian Gulf crisis has apparently failed.

Cancellation of gasoline rationing was reported by the official Iraqi News Agency. It also said the oil minister had been fired and replaced by Saddam Hussein's son-in-law.

The New York Times ... reported Sunday the rationing move was a ruse by Iraq to let the world think the sanctions were working, and thus forestall a military attack against Iraq.

Rationing was imposed not because Iraq was short of oil — it controls 20 percent of the world's supply — but reportedly because the global embargo affected supplies of additives needed for refining.

Iraqi officials blamed the sanctions for the shortage. But the news agency said the Oil Ministry miscalculated the amount of chemical additives necessary to refine crude oil into gasoline and other products.

The New York Times, quoting Kuwaiti oil officials, reported Sunday the rationing move was a ruse by Iraq to let the world think the sanctions were working, and thus forestall a military attack against Iraq. That report was published before the latest Iraqi announcement.

In other developments, an envoy to Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev met with Iraqi President Saddam in Baghdad, and Gorbachev arrived in Paris for talks with French President Francois Mitterrand on matters including the nearly 3-month-old Persian Gulf crisis.

Soviet Foreign Minister Eduard Shevardnadze said Sunday night that envoy Yevgeny Primakov's talks with Saddam had not borne fruit.

"For the moment, there are not many reasons for optimism" coming from the talks, Shevardnadze said in Paris. He did not elaborate, but said he still hoped the gulf standoff could be resolved peacefully.

Primakov has emerged as the main shuttling diplomat in the conflict, which began when Iraq invaded Kuwait Aug. 2 and occupied the emirate. Iraq was in turn isolated by U.N. trade sanctions and widespread international condemnation.

The United States has said that up to 100,000 U.S. troops could be sent to join an estimated 220,000 troops already in the region.
