## Jets stream past Pokes ...

EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. (AP) — Rookie Terance Mathis tied an NFL record with a 98-yard punt return, sparking the New York Jets past the Dallas Cowboys 24-9 Sunday.

The Jets (4-5) also benefited from two personal fouls by Dallas defenders in winning consecutively for the first time this season. New York had been 0-4 lifetime against Dallas, which fell to 3-6 this season.

Mathis, filling in for the injured JoJo Townsell, caught Mike Saxon's 60-yard punt over his shoulder late in the second quarter. Mathis headed straight upfield, broke open, cut right and had only Saxon to outrun to the end zone for his first NFL touchdown.

Three others have had 98-yard

punt returns, the most recent Dallas' Dennis Morgan against St. Louis in 1974.

The punt return was the only score for the Jets in the first half. They had two first downs and 46 total yards, and held the ball just 6:48.

For all their first-half dominance, the Cowboys managed only 37-and 35-yard field goals by Ken Willis. As it did in upsetting Houston the previous week, the New York defense yielded considerable yardage but few points.

When the Jets self-destructed on their first series of the third period, Dallas took over at the New York 47. The Cowboys got to the 22, where Kyle Clifton picked off Troy Aikman's ill-advised pass over the middle into heavy coverage.

## ... Rams trickle past Oilers

ANAHEIM, Calif. (AP) — Bobby Humphery and his mates in the secondary have been the goats in many of the Los Angeles Rams' losses this year.

On Sunday, Humphery and the rest of the defense were the heroes in a 17-13 victory over the Houston Oilers.

Los Angeles limited Warren Moon and the Oilers to a lone touchdown and provided big plays to preserve the victory for the Rams (3-5).

"We know we're a good secondary," Humphery said after he batted away a pass at the Rams goal line with 40 seconds remaining to end the final threat by the Oilers (4-5).

"It's just a matter of us executing. We can play some good ball back

there," added Humphery, who snuffed a drive earlier in the first quarter with an interception.

The Rams hadn't been playing good ball "back there," going 2-10 in the league in pass defense and last in total defense.

As he had done the previous week in a 17-12 loss to the New York Jets, Moon topped 300 yards passing, had trouble getting the ball into the end zone. He completed 26 of 41 passes for 343 yards against the Rams but forced two costly interceptions.

"We didn't cash in when we were inside the 20," Moon said. "I would drop eight people back there and try to do it with the pass and just didn't make the plays."

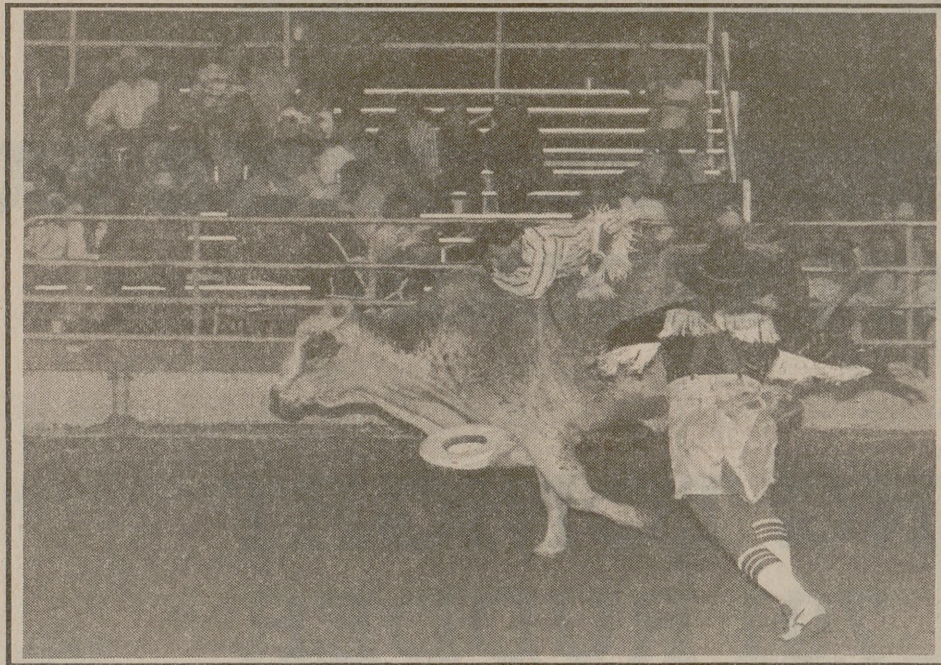
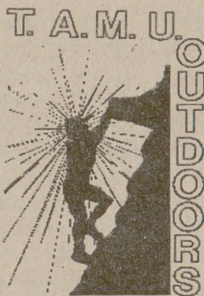

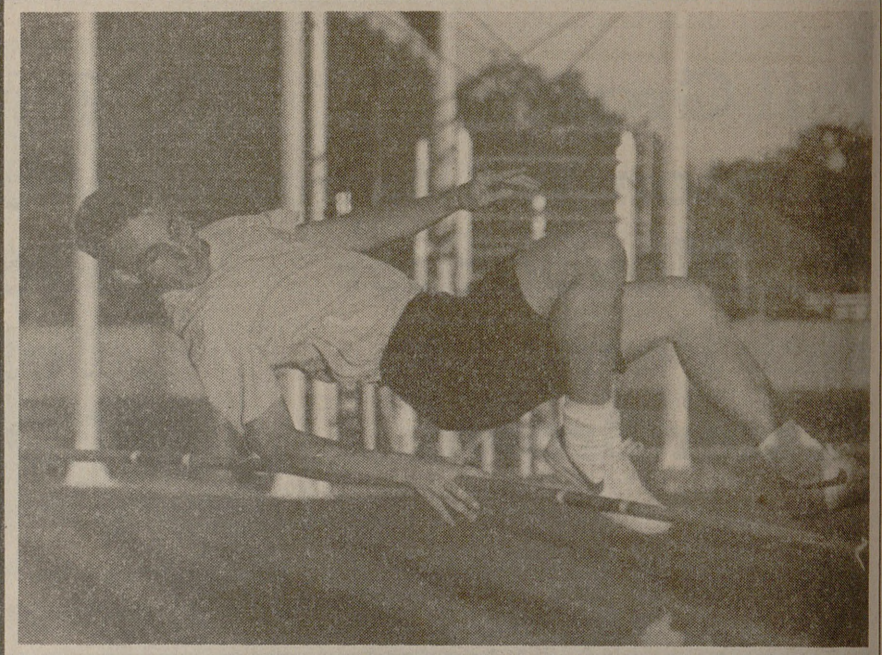
