**Cowboys can't stop
49ers' winning streak**

IRVING (AP) — Joe Montana completed 12 passes to Jerry Rice for 147 yards and a touchdown on Sunday night, keeping alive the San Francisco 49ers hopes for a perfect season with a 24-6 victory over the downtrodden Dallas Cowboys.

Montana, playing his first game in Texas Stadium, led the 49ers to their ninth consecutive victory this season to stay tied with the New York Giants as the only unbeaten teams in the NFL.

He completed 27 of 37 passes for 290 yards and capped the performance by scoring on a 4-yard run with 3:12 to play to put away the punchless Cowboys.

Dallas dropped to 3-7 as it lost to the 49ers for the sixth consecutive time.

San Francisco won its 17th consecutive game, including playoffs, and extended its NFL regular-season record of 15 consecutive road victories.

Montana didn't play in last year's 31-14 victory and hadn't made an appearance in the Dallas area since he guided Notre Dame to a 35-34 victory over Houston in the 1979 Cotton Bowl.

The 49ers spotted Dallas a 3-0 first period lead on Ken Willis' 23-yard field goal, the sixth time San Francisco has trailed this season.

**Olajuwon carries Rockets
over flat-note Jazz, 110-90**

HOUSTON (AP) — Akeem Olajuwon had 31 points and 21 rebounds and scored seven during a 21-2 run that carried the Houston Rockets to a 110-90 victory over the Utah Jazz on Sunday night.

Utah took advantage of a 2-for-16 shooting slump by Houston to take a 79-78 lead with 8:27 remaining in the game.

But the Rockets regained the lead for good on their next possession with a three-point play by Otis Thorpe that started the 21-2

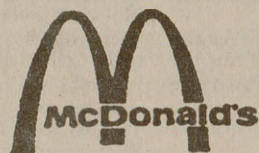
spurt. Kenny Smith, who finished with 15 points, also scored 7 during the run that gave Houston a 99-81 lead with 3:06 remaining.

Utah guard Darrell Griffith, inserted into the starting lineup when Jeff Malone could not play because of a back sprain, scored 24 points to pass the 12,000-point mark for his career. The 10-year pro from Louisville has scored 12,003 points.

John Stockton also scored 24 for Utah and Karl Malone had 17 points and 14 rebounds.

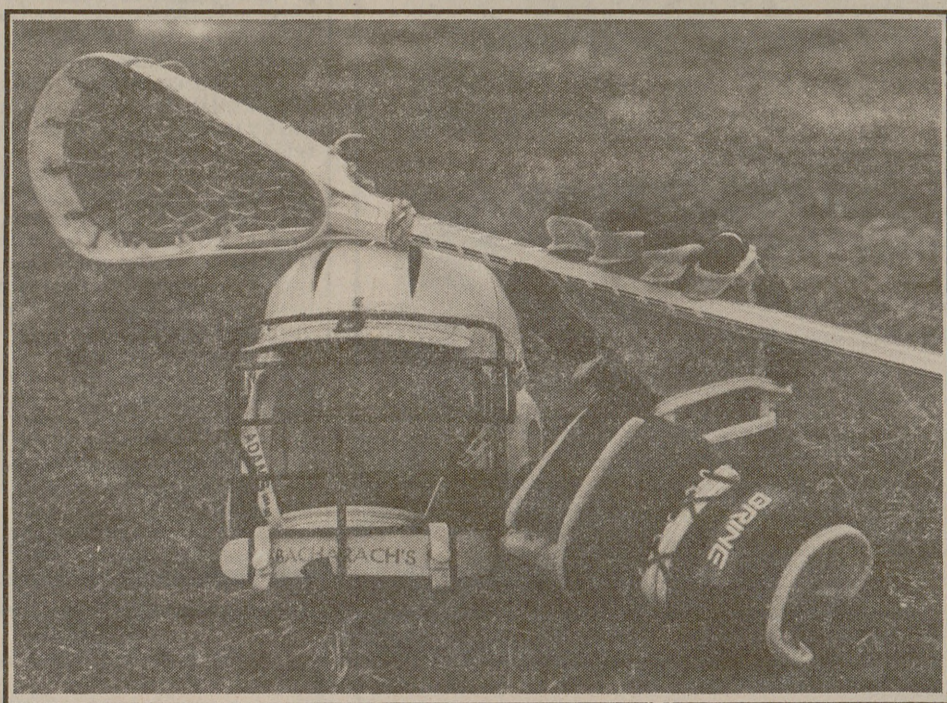
