



Former University of Houston ing it once. football coach Jack Pardee said it best: "This was so helpful to several of my players, I am now making the whole football team take the cour-

Pardee read about a memory crease their G.P.A. to those seminar held by noted memory expert Alvin Jackson and sent three players who needed to pass some important tests in order to stay in school.
