New judge to begin next year, help decrease criminal caseload

AUSTIN (AP) — A new federal judge will set up office in the U.S. Courthouse by next summer or fall, according to federal Judge James Nowlin, whose docket has been clogged with criminal cases for the

past four years. "I'm looking forward to a great improvement when the new judge is sworn in," Nowlin, Austin's only fulltime federal judge, said. "Because of the criminal caseload, I'm seldom able to reach a civil case as fast as I

want to Nowlin has 653 cases pending in his court, 117 criminal and 536 civil. Congress last month approved money for the hiring of a second

federal judge, whose job is granted for life.

Woman shot to death while tracking husband

HOUSTON (AP) — A woman her husband was inside, began to who tracked her husband to a rendezvous with an alleged paramour was slain when she broke into the wrong house, officials said.

Priscilla Brayboy was shot to death by a homeowner early Sunday when she forced her way into a house where she believed her husband was having an affair, Harris County Sheriff's Department Sgt. Bruce

Williams said. Williams said Brayboy, 32, and a friend drove down a northern Har-ris County street looking for her husband, Joe Brayboy. When the women spotted a gray Volvo parked in a driveway on the street, Mrs. Brayboy thought it balonged to her Brayboy thought it belonged to her husband.

When Mrs. Brayboy knocked on the door, a woman answered, Wil-liams said. Mrs. Brayboy, believing force her way into the house, he said

A man inside the home heard the commotion and armed himself with a shotgun, Williams said. As Mrs. Brayboy lunged through the door, the man shot her, the officer said. When Mrs. Brayboy's friend saw

what had happened, she ran down the street screaming and noticed another gray Volvo parked in another driveway a few houses away. The woman went to that house and found Joe Brayboy inside, Williams said

Mrs. Brayboy was taken by Life Flight helicopter to Hermann Hos-pital, where she was pronounced dead at 1:37 a.m.

The homeowner who did the shooting was questioned and re-leased, Williams said. The case will be referred to a grand jury.

Former thief helps auto dealers prevent crimes

AUSTIN (AP) — An ex-convict who claims to have driven the fast lane as a car thief for more than three decades is now steering straight and teaching auto dealers how to protect themselves, a newspa-

per reported Monday. After a stint in federal prison, John Stanley, 47, of Austin is gearing up for graduate school at the University of Texas and has security consulting contracts with car dealers in Austin and San Antonio.

'I don't think like a criminal now, but I am one, and I've been one for decades," Stanley told the Austin-American Statesman. "I have been a career criminal, involved in some form of crime, all my adult life," he said.

Stanley's life of crime began at 14 when he stole his first car in Amarillo.

He estimates he has stolen as many as 1,000 cars, yachts, airplanes and heavy machinery and made anywhere from \$100,000 to \$500,000 per year to finance a high-rolling lifestyle of luxury and deceit.

He gained the protection of pow-ful officials in Mexico, where erful many of his stolen cars were sold, and laughs when he recalls watching the queen of England transported in a luxury car during a visit to Belize. Stanley said the car was one he had stolen




