Hostages may be allowed to leave Iraq

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) — Iraq will begin allowing foreign hostages to leave the country beginning on Christmas "unless something would take place that mars the atmosphere of peace," Iraqi officials said Sunday.

Baghdad's latest peace move came as the United States worked to secure international approval for a U.N. resolution authorizing the use of force to dislodge Iraqi troops from Kuwait, which Iraq invaded Aug. 2. The White House dismissed the move.

Iraq said the estimated 600 Westerners and

others held at strategic sites since the early stages of the Persian Gulf crisis could all be freed by March, an official announcement on Baghdad television said.

The Iraq News Agency said the decision was made in a meeting presided by President Saddam Hussein.

INA said it was decided "that foreign guests would be allowed to travel on batches as from Dec. 25 and within a period of three months, the last batch of which would leave the Iraqi territories on March 25 unless something would take

place that mars the atmosphere of peace." Iraq has been encouraged to make such a move in an effort to clear the way for some peace talks. Practically every elder statesman has visited Iraq on peace missions — from former British Prime Minister Edward Heath to ex-Chancellor Willy Brandt — told officials in Baghdad that that would be the proper step.

The release of the foreigners may be an attempt to forestall any decision by the U.S. administration to go to war over the next few months.
