Frustrated residents patrol neighborhoods

DALLAS (AP) — Residents of two low-income neighborhoods here have become so frustrated with violent crime that groups of them are patrolling their areas with shotguns, a city councilwoman said Tuesday.

"There is significant crime within the Dallas area," Deputy Mayor Pro Tem Diane Ragsdale said. "However, there is greater crime in poor neighborhoods. To that end, neighborhoods have looked for a means of survival."

Police are predicting record levels of violent crime in Dallas. A new yearly high already has been set for homicides. But officers said the patrols could result in an increased number of shootings.

"We certainly encourage citizens to get involved to help the police fight crime," police spokesman Sgt. Jim Chandler said. "We do not encourage citizens to arm themselves to do this."

Ragsdale said poor, minority neighborhoods dissatisfied with police protection are just looking for ways to cope.

"I think a lot of it is out of frustration," she said. "The police department constantly says that they're overworked and underpaid and stretched too thin. And so the community is looking for constructive ways to help themselves."

"Middle-class neighborhoods can hire off-duty police officers or security officers," she said. "Poor neighborhoods cannot afford that luxury."

They do live in America, and people have a right to defend themselves and their neighborhoods and their families, as long as it's within the law."

Ragsdale denied the groups were made up of vigilantes.

"These are responsible people that are doing this," she said. "These aren't irresponsible people."

But Chandler said armed citizens' patrols are dangerous.

"There's no telling who they might encounter when they're out there doing that," he said.

City Councilman Jim Buerger agreed, adding: "It's tough enough for our officers to know when to shoot and when not to shoot, when to advance and when to retreat."

Assistant City Attorney Don Postell said he is investigating the legality of the shotgun patrols and will report to city council members within two weeks. As a result, Ragsdale did not identify the groups involved, except to say they are located in her southern Dallas district.

Postell said state gun statutes prohibit displaying a firearm in a public place "in a manner that tends to alarm."

"What is a display calculated to alarm?" he said. "I'm going to have to go back and see how the courts have interpreted the statutes."

Ragsdale said she would inform her constituents of Postell's conclusion.

In another development, Councilman Al Lipscomb said he would introduce a measure Wednesday asking the governor to send the Texas National Guard to Dallas to fight violent crime.
