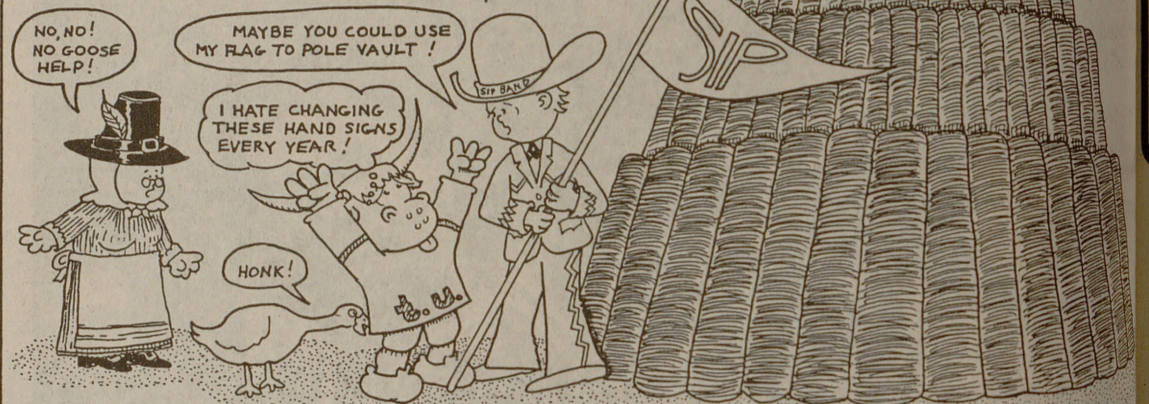

## Player denies involvement in sexual harassment case

FOXBORO, Mass. (AP) — Michael Timpson denied any involvement in the sexual harassment of a female reporter in the New England Patriots locker room and an attorney for Zeke Mowatt said Wednesday the controversy is "far from over."

One day after NFL commissioner Paul Tagliabue fined Mowatt \$12,500 and Timpson and Robert Perryman \$5,000 each in connection with the Sept. 17 incident, Robert Fraley, Mowatt's attorney, told the Boston Globe:

"If (Tagliabue) thinks this is over, then he is mistaken. This thing is far from over."

Tagliabue imposed the penalties after receiving a 60-page report of an investigation of the incident involving Lisa Olson of the Boston Herald.

"I had nothing to do with the issue. I stick by it," Timpson said. "All the rest of you have to talk to my legal representatives."

Mowatt asked a reporter in the locker room Wednesday, "what was in the report?" When questioned by writers, he repeatedly gave out the phone number of Fraley.

"I'll speak within time," said Mowatt. Fraley said he would meet with Mowatt next week, according to the Boston Globe.

"We will go before whatever forum necessary to see that justice is done here. We are going to look at every reasonable basis to proceed legally in this case," the

newspaper quoted Fraley as saying.

Perryman, now with the Dallas Cowboys after being cut Nov. 5, refused comment. His agent, Robert Farney, said, "We have every intention of vindicating Robert's name. We feel strongly that he was implicated unjustifiably."

The report, based on an investigation headed by Harvard Law professor Philip Heymann, was critical of New England general manager Patrick Sullivan. It said he didn't act quickly to handle the issue or take the incident seriously enough.

Sullivan refused Wednesday to comment on the Sept. 17 incident or the report.

On Sept. 30, Patriots' owner Victor Kiam told Sullivan he was considering suspending him. Tagliabue told Kiam to refrain from acting against Sullivan until the investigation was completed. Since the report was issued, Kiam has not commented on Sullivan's future.

Tagliabue also fined the Patriots \$50,000, half of which has been designated to pay for materials for a 28 NFL teams designed to instruct them about dealing responsibly with the media.

In a letter to Kiam, Tagliabue said, "Mowatt's conduct involved both verbal and demonstrative actions. Timpson and Perryman encouraged the misconduct and contributed significantly to creating an atmosphere in which improper activity was evidently considered permissible."

# Permian allegations will not be investigated

ODESSA (AP) — The governing body of high school athletics in Texas won't immediately pursue an investigation into allegations that Odessa Permian High School coaches received secretive payments from boosters.

The Fort Worth Star-Telegram reported Wednesday that former Permian football coach Gary Gaines received at least \$15,000 in cash from boosters after both the 1988 and 1989 seasons. A booster who

was not identified told the newspaper the payments allegedly occurred for more than a decade.

"We are not involved at this time," Bill Farney, athletic director of the University Interscholastic League, said Wednesday. "The District 4-5A executive committee has heard testimony about those concerns."

"It fell into the executive committee's jurisdiction. And as far as we are concerned, that case was adjudi-

cated by the committee," Farney said.

The District 4-5A executive committee, comprising superintendents from Midland, Odessa, Abilene and San Angelo, met in a closed session on Nov. 16 in Big Spring.

Findings from internal investigations by Odessa Permian and Midland Lee High School were revealed at the meeting, Farney said.

After studying the testimony which included discussion of payments by boosters to the two school coaches, the executive committee chose not to forward the case to the UIL, said Chuck Hornung, spokesman for the Ector County Independent School District, which includes Permian.

"Financial payments were discussed in the investigation, and they were discussed in the committee meeting. But as far as amounts, I am not aware of what they were," Hornung said.

UIL rules prohibit annual gifts or bonuses to coaches in excess of \$500 from any source, including booster clubs.

Ted Miller, coordinator of communications for the Midland Independent School District, said investigations into possible wrongdoing at Midland Lee are closed.

"Unless someone brings up something else, it's over," Miller said. "I kind of like going to the courts. If parties are happy with the ruling, then that's where it stays. We certainly aren't going to pursue it."

An unidentified Permian booster told the Fort Worth newspaper the amount of the cash payments were determined largely by how well the Panthers advanced in the state playoffs.

Gaines left Permian after the 1989 state championship and now is an assistant coach at Texas Tech in Lubbock. He was on a recruiting trip Wednesday and not available for comment.

The Permian program is one of the most successful in the country, was the top-rated football team the nation last year. But this year the team was banned from defending its state title because coaches held organized practices too early in the year.
