"All people implicated in this attack were arrested," the official TAP news agency reported, adding all are "Palestinians known to the PLO." Israeli army radio said as many as a dozen people

The police report made public Tuesday said the three men were killed with two Kalishnikov automatic rifles. Initial reports said the gunman used an AK-47 assault rifle.
