PARKER (AP) — Southfork Ranch was closed recently and sold for foreclosure. But that hasn't kept nundreds of tourists from flocking the estate made famous by the elevision show "Dallas.

The ranch, which has been closed since Jan. 1, is viewed from the locked front gate or fence by about 50 people each weekday, security guard Michael Hayes said. On Saturdays, the number grows to 100.
