A&M bows to Hogs

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. (AP) — Delmonica DeHorney's 28 points led the 11th-ranked Lady Razorbacks of Arkansas to a 90-66 rout Tuesday night of Southwest Conference rival Texas A&M.

"It was Del's kind of game," Arkansas coach John Sutherland said. "A&M played the kind of defense that allowed us to (get the ball) inside to her. We spread the court and Del was open."

The win by Arkansas (16-2, 6-0)

extended its home winning streak to 15 games.

Texas A&M (8-8, 3-3) held the lead briefly in the first half. But a 12-2 surge by Arkansas gave the Lady Razorbacks a 24-14 lead with 9:54 remaining before intermission. Arkansas led 45-36 at halftime.

For Texas A&M, Vanessa Edwards topped the scoring with 17 points, followed by Yvonne Hill with 15, and 12 each from Sheri Dillard and Dena Russo.

Former Dodger Drysdale arrested for drunk driving

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Hall of Fame pitcher Don Drysdale is scheduled to be arraigned Feb. 11 on a charge of felony drunken driving stemming from a traffic accident that injured a woman, police said.

Drysdale, 54, was arrested Monday night about 8:30 p.m. PST after the car he was driving collided with another vehicle. Drysdale, who was alone in his car, was making a left turn, police officer Tom Ohmer said.

A breath test after the accident showed Drysdale, an announcer for the Los Angeles Dodgers, had a blood-alcohol level of .19, more than twice the legal limit of .08, Ohmer said.

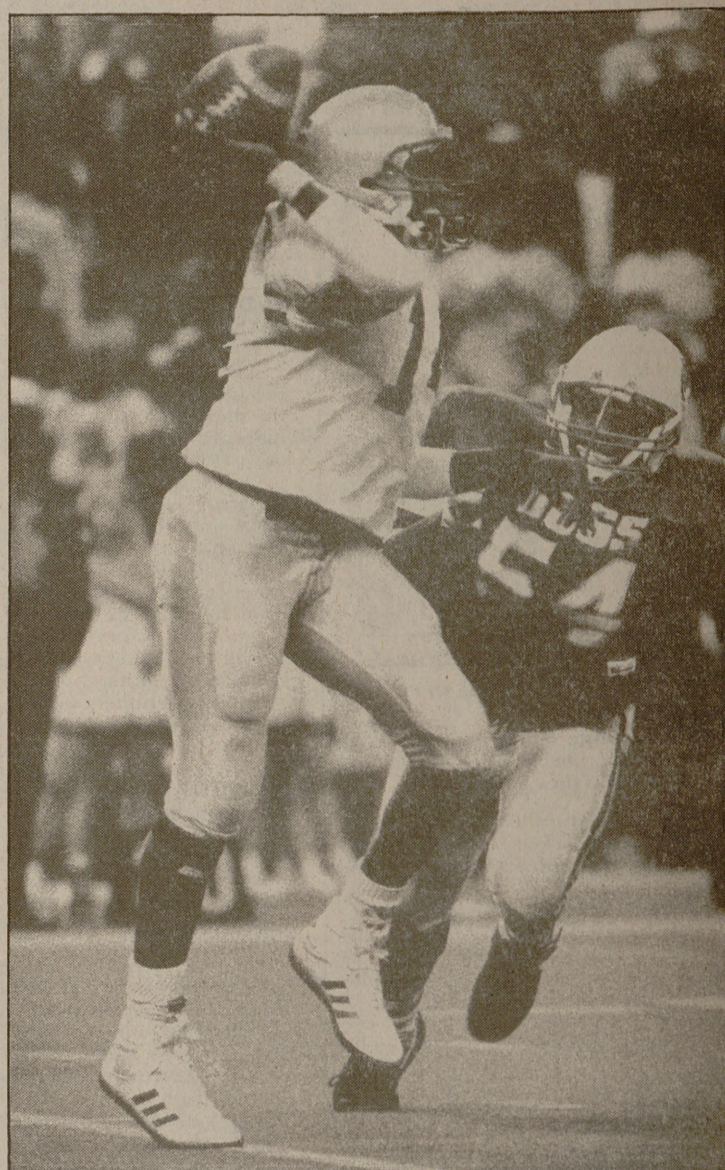
A 24-year-old woman driving the

other car suffered bruises and abrasions and was taken to St. Joseph Hospital in Burbank, Ohmer said. Drysdale was booked and posted \$5,000 bail a few hours later, police said.

Drysdale pitched for the Dodgers from 1956 to 1969 and was inducted into baseball's Hall of Fame in 1984. He had a 209-167 record and a 2.95 ERA.

The 1962 Cy Young Award winner, he pitched 58 consecutive scoreless innings in 1968, a record that stood until Orel Hershiser of the Dodgers surpassed it by one in 1988.

Before joining the Dodgers' announcing team in 1988, Drysdale worked for ABC-TV as an announcer.

Preston commits to A&M

Tommy Preston, A&M Consolidated's All-State quarterback, verbally committed to Texas A&M Tuesday.

Preston led the Tigers to two consecutive 14-1 records and kept them at the top of the Associated Press Class 4A football poll throughout the regular season. Consolidated lost in the state semi-finals to Austin Westlake this season and to Chapel Hill in 1989's state final.

Preston, 6-2, 187 pounds, becomes the eighth prep player to commit to A&M, joining Consol-

idated's Cliff Groce. Rick Daniel (wide receiver) from Benton, Ark., Sean Terry (punter) from Gunter, and Dennis Allen (defensive back) from L. D. Bell in Hurst committed earlier.

Monday, the Aggies received commitments from Mike Cody (offensive lineman) from San Antonio Jay, James McKeenan (tight end) from Willis, and Antonio Shorter (linebacker) from Houston Kashmere.

Verbal commitments are non-binding. February 6 is the first day that players can sign a letter-of-intent to attend a university.
