

Aggies open season, face Pan American

The 14th-ranked Texas A&M baseball team will open its 1991 sea-son today as the Aggies travel to Edinburg to face the University of Texas-Pan American.

The Aggies swept the Broncs last season at Olsen Field 3-1, 7-2, 8-1. A&M Head Coach Mark Johnson said last week that the Broncs' can be tough in their own ballpark, especially because of the bad weather that A&M has experienced this week. "We have been at a disadvantage this week, because of the weather," Johnson said. "We would have liked to simulate some game situations, but just but not been able the outfield has been too wet

They've had great weather down there for the most part, and they should be way ahead of us.'

The starting Aggie lineup should be: Ronnie Allen, pitcher; Blake Pyle, catcher; Conrad Colby, first base; Sittichoke Huckuntod, second base; Jason Marshall, shortstop; Travis Williams, third base; Dan Robinson, rightfield; Tim Holt, centerfield; Brian Thomas, leftfield; David

Rollen, designated hitter. A&M will open its home schedule Tuesday afternoon when the Ag-gies host Southwest Texas St. in a 1 p.m. doubleheader at Olsen Field. The Aggies were 37-6 at home last season. They were 43-17 overall.

Rockets edge Cavaliers

RICHFIELD, Ohio (AP) - David Wood hit a go-ahead 3-pointer with 19.7 seconds left and Buck Johnson clinching free throws with 1.1 seconds to go as the Houston Rockets beat the Cleveland Cavaliers 96-92 Thursday night, spoiling John Williams' return. Williams, whose \$5 million salary

and bonus this year makes him the league's highest-paid player, re-turned from a sprained left foot sus-tained Nov. 16. He scored just four points for the Cavaliers, who got 23

points for the Cavaliers, who got 23 from Larry Nance in losing for the 24th time in 29 games. Johnson scored 22 points and Kenny Smith 17 for Houston, 10-8 since losing Akeem Olajuwon to an eye injury Jan. 4. The Rockets have won four in a row and and seven of eight

eight. Cleveland led 92-91 after Brad Daugherty made two foul shots with 35.1 seconds left. Larry Smith fouled out on the play and was re-placed by Wood, who then swished the 3-pointer from the left side of the key for a 94-92 Houston lead.

The Cavaliers' Steve Kerr, who had made two 3-point shots earlier in the game to become the NBA's alltime most accurate 3-point shooter, tried another as the clock was wind-

ing down, but it hit off the rim. Teammate Craig Ehlo chased down the offensive rebound and missed a 15-footer from the right baseline. Johnson grabbed the ball and was fouled, making both free throws to seal the verdict.


