She is the replacement for forward Dena Russo, who abruptly ended her collegiate career after a long battle with her knees.

Janak, who ended with 10 points and four rebounds, gathered two key rebounds down the stretch that enabled the Lady Ags to hold on for victory.

"It inspired me to fill her (Russo's) shoes," Janak said. "To ask someone to do that would be a chore. However, it just inspires me more to do better."

Coach Hickey was impressed with the Lady Ags performance despite the SMU comeback, and she credited almost everyone with playing an equal part in the victory.

She added that a defensive lapse may have been the cause of the Lady Ags' slight demise in the second half.

"We may have extended our defense a little too early," Hickey said. "We tried to start in that full-court man press and we may have been better off just starting with a half-court man press."

**Detmer expects to come back at full strength**

FORT WORTH (AP) — Ty Detmer, the Brigham Young University quarterback who separated both shoulders during a 55-13 Holiday Bowl loss to Texas A&M, said Monday he will be in top condition for the start of the 1991 season.

Detmer said he will miss spring training, but will be at full speed for the Cougars' season opener Aug. 29 in the Pigskin Classic against Florida State.

The Heisman Trophy winner was in Fort Worth to receive the Davey O'Brien Award as the nation's top collegiate quarterback.

"I should be ready just after the spring. I'm going to throw all summer, and I'll be ready when the season starts. Our last two losses to Hawaii and A&M left a bad taste in my mouth," he said.

BYU coach Lavell Edwards, who was on hand for the Davey O'Brien ceremony, said he doesn't think Detmer's missing spring practice will hurt the Cougars next year.

"We just made up our mind not to use him this spring, and we'll work in our younger players," Edwards said. "It was unusual that Ty separated both shoulders in the same game, but we believe he will bounce back and be OK."

Detmer, winner of the Heisman Trophy last season, has broken 42 NCAA passing records and tied 5.
