"I basically did not want to be on her out list," said Donald Bonham of Houston, chairman of the Fiesta buy influence.

The post-election windfall is a practice known in Austin political circles as joining "the late train."

Bonham supported Williams in the general election with contributions totaling \$25,000. But after Richards won, he gave \$10,000 to help retire her campaign debt.

Even lobbyist Billy Clayton, a close adviser and major financial contributor who gave more than \$9,000 to Williams, sent Richards a check for \$1,000 after the election, the news-

paper reported.

The News, using campaign finance reports filed with the Texas secretary of state, reviewed contributions of at least \$500 in cash or inkind contributions reported by Richards and Williams between Jan. 1, 1989, and Jan. 1, 1991.
