## Park

He said the state and federal government have made commitments to biological diversification through endangered species legislation.

However, the endangered orchids, or *Spiranthes parksi*, at Lick Creek Park are not covered by either state or federal protection. Federal laws apply only to federal land or areas where federal money is invested.

The state law also applies only to endangered plants being taken from property for sale. It does not cover disturbing the flower's habitat.

Wilson said other species of wildflower, like the Meadow Rue, also could be in the same situation as the Navasota Ladies'-Tress, although these other species in the park are rare and not endangered.

He said there are so few Navasota Ladies'-Tresses in the park — only several hundred — that he and other researchers keep track of individual flowers.

He said he is most concerned about the erosion around feeders to the creek that might result from the bike race.

"The plant occurs on the banks," Wilson said. "Anything that destroys the banks destroys the flower. Erosion occurs naturally, but adding

bikes is a problem." The original racing course went through the area in which Wilson has studied the orchid. The revised route, however, still travels along Raccoon Run, where the orchids are known to grow.

Charles Fischman, administrative coordinator for the National Off-Road Bicycle Association — the race's national sponsor — said NORBA's policy asks all member clubs to respect the environment when establishing a race course and while conducting races.

Fischman said general guidelines state that organizations should get permission from land owners or managers when organizing a race, with the assumption that the owner or manager would not allow the race if he thought it would be destructive to the land.

"Members of our organization are generally well-informed about land-use issues," he said. "We're quite sensitive to the issue." Fischman said the B-CS environmentalists' reactions are similar to what already is happening throughout the country.

"College Station is not the first time bikers have run up against environmental sensitivity," he said.

Steve Beachy, College Station director of Parks and Recreation, said the Parks and Recreation Board granted the concession to the race because the park was created solely for the endangered flower. No rule in the city ordinance prohibits riding bikes in the park.

There also was not another large enough for the course originally suggested, he said. "They didn't commit to any long-term use of the park for racing," Beachy said. "The long-term use of bikes in that park."

City officials are looking at the race as a test case. "In my opinion, this particular race will not have a long-term effect on the park," Beachy said. "The bigger issue is if that is continued, what will be the effect on the park."

Thurlow, however, said he hopes to hold the race at Lick Creek Park once every year. Dr. Sharon Colson, chairman of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board, said the board will review the park before the race. She also said future management of the park probably will be an agenda item at the board's meeting March 5.
