In most sports, athletes that transfer from one school to another have to sit out a year before regaining their eligibility.

But, in NCAA baseball, athletes that wish to transfer must obtain a release of their scholarship and the approval of both coaches to transfer without losing eligibility.

Hickey said that he was able to gain a release from the OU after five weeks of trying.

One of Hickey's coaches in summer baseball told him that A&M might be interested in him.

"They had a great reputation and a great tradition," he said. "I feel unlucky that I had to switch universities, but I am lucky I got the opportunity to play for two Division I schools."

Hickey said he knew he was going to A&M two weeks before the fall semester began.

Once at A&M, Hickey said he noticed the academics were much tougher and his teammates approach to the game was different. "The attitude of the players is a lot

better than at Oklahoma," Hickey said. "At OU, it is a lot more laid back."

"It took me a while to adapt to it." Now that he has had a chance to play at Olsen Field, Hickey has noticed that the fans are a lot different.

"I've never played in front of fans that rag like that," he said. "The fans make it great."

Hickey did not have much of a chance to impress the A&M coaching staff in the fall because he broke his index finger the second week of practice.

But, he did not let the injury discourage him. "It did not depress me at all," he said. "I was glad I broke the finger in the fall instead of in the spring."

Now, the only thing Hickey is thinking about is this weekend's series at LSU.

"I am looking forward to it because it is going to be exciting," he said. "Not many teams get to play the No. 1 team in the nation."

After a 5-12 start, A&M has two of its last five games. Sophomore Brooks Thompson has been the Aggies leading scorer in those games averaging almost 22 points per game while shooting 69.5 percent from the field.

Thompson is the only player in five statistical categories in the conference to rank in the top five in five statistical categories in the play.

Davis said Thompson's success can be attributed to some of his fellow teammates.

"I think what's really helped is Freddie Ricks," he said. "He raised the level of his game, that's taken some of the burden off Brooks having to handle the ball much."

"Brooks has really responded." The Lady Aggies are riding a four-game winning streak and have improved their record to 11-10 while sitting in the middle of the pack in SWC standings with a 7-6 record.

Arkansas is 13-1 in the conference, 22-3 overall.
