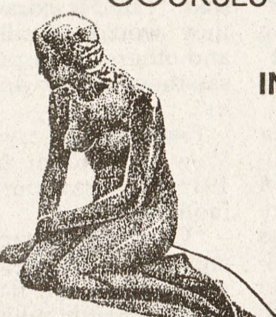

Utility Commission approves rate case

AUSTIN - The Texas Public Utility Commission approved a \$47.5 million settlement Wednesday in Gulf States Utilities Co.'s electric rate case. The settlement was opposed by the Office of Public Utility Counsel, which represents residential and small commercial ratepayers before the PUC.
