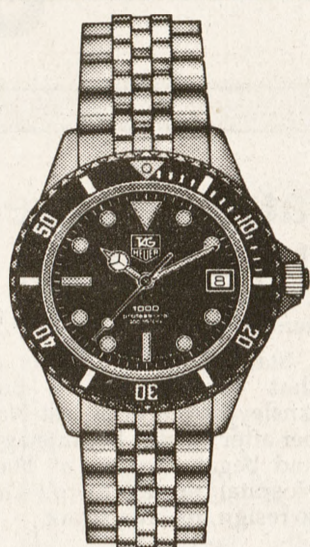

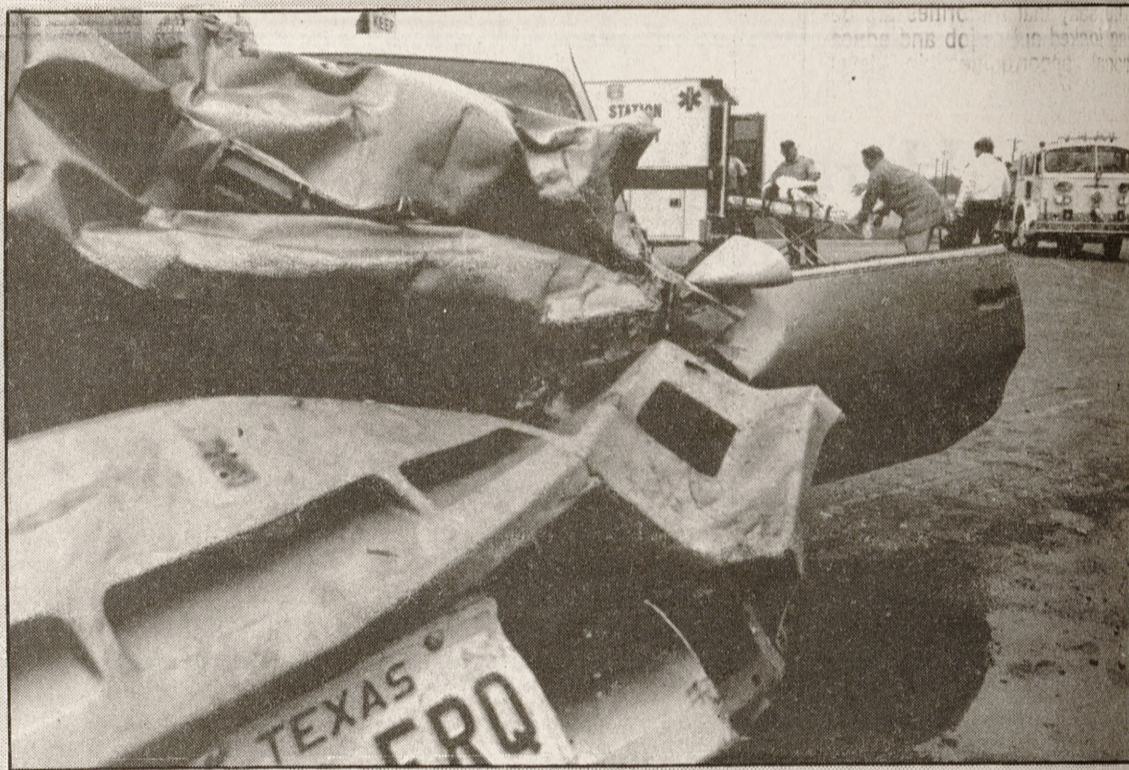

Head-on collision

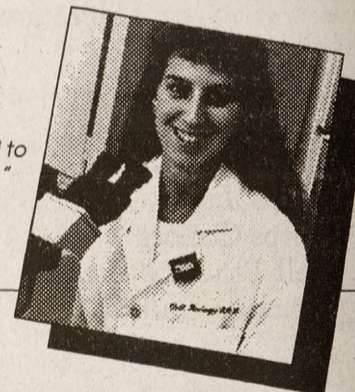
