### Customs Service raids airfield, captures aircraft, papers

DALLAS (AP) — Customs agents Wednesday seized a helicopter belonging to a Chilean arms dealer who is under investigation for alleged weapons sales to Iraq.

The modified long-range commercial copter, which can be used in warfare, was displayed by the U.S. Customs Service at Redbird Airport after it was seized inside a storage hangar.

Connie Fenchel, special agent in charge of the Customs Service office in Dallas, said a search warrant also was executed at a Fort Worth-area company where records were being seized.
