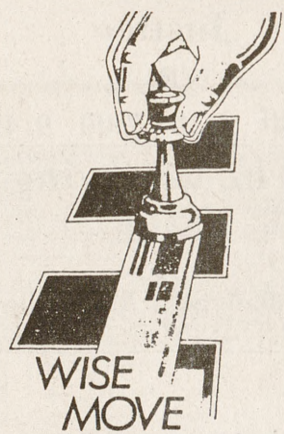

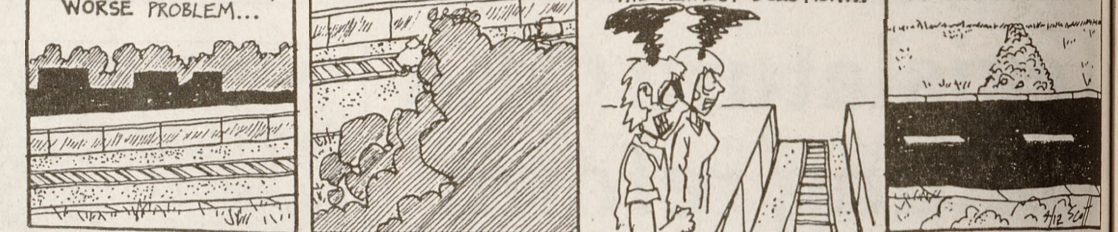

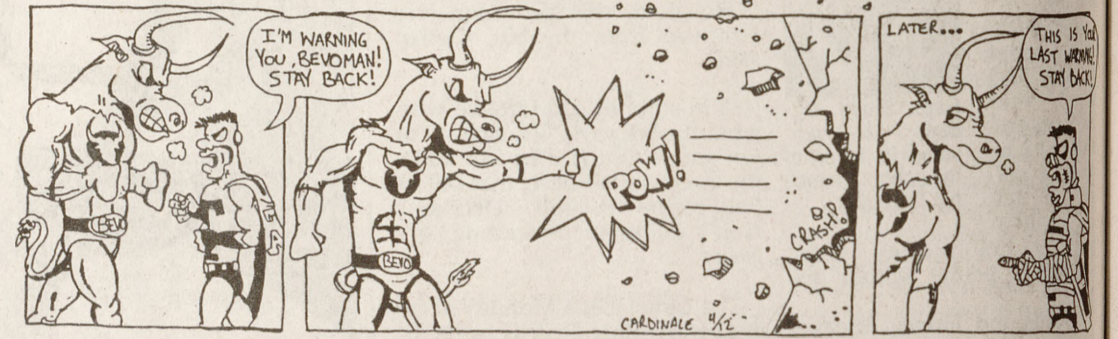

he said. "If you just want to get your grade and get out and you're not in it for the knowledge, then it's OK. You can ace the class by not even showing up."
Dr. Carolyn Adair, director of student activities, said these types of entrepreneurial ventures are not uncommon but the University has taken steps to eliminate them from campus.

These steps include banning Tutors Unlimited from using A&M buildings.
Adair said the Concessions Committee was alerted to the problem by building proctors and chemistry professors who noticed that class attendance was slipping.

Because they're not connected, Naugle said it's not the job of the department to worry about whether the notes are correct or the review sessions accurate.

"What goes on between her and the students is between them," Naugle said. "Dr. Duller made it quite clear to the students that he was not endorsing any reviews. He does not encourage students to go to these at all."

Naugle said many students may not have realized that Justitz was a student worker, not a teaching assistant. It was part of the confusion, he said.

Tutoring services who operate on campus must have a contract with the University through the Concessions Committee.

Investor says train will use private funds

AUSTIN (AP) - A proposed 200 mph "bullet" train linking Texas' major cities could be built without taxpayer help, said the head of a French-backed investors group.
However, the group's leader refused to rule out accepting public help if the consortium, called Texas TGV, wins the contract.

"This will be the first major infrastructure project in the United States fully funded by private industry," said William J. Agee, chairman of the Morrison-Knudsen Corp. and a managing director for French-backed Texas TGV.

Texas TGV and Texas FastTrack Inc., a German-backed group, are competing for the state's high-speed rail franchise, which is estimated to cost up to \$7 billion.

close trading relationship with Mexico.
"Texas, more than any other single state, would be a major winner," Cavitt said.

Von Bertrab said the agreement would help Mexico rejuvenate its poor economy by increasing the export market.

The proposed trilateral trade agreement comes on the heels of a similar trade agreement between the United States and Canada.

"We want to export goods to people," von Bertrab said. Hammill said Canada felt it should enter into the agreement during the formulation phase instead of trying to join the trading relationship in later years.

In January of 1989 the U.S.-Canada agreement went into effect, removing trade barriers between the two countries over the next several years.

All three said the agreement has met opposition, especially from the United States, from labor groups, labor-intensive industries and environmentalists.

In June of 1990, the presidents of Mexico and the United States entered into an "agreement of principle" on removing trade barriers.

The AFL-CIO and apparel manufacturers are against the agreement because of Mexico's cheaper labor, Hammill said.

Hammill said the Canadian government looked into joining the agreement with the United States and Mexico in September and formally announced its intent to join in February.

Cavitt said environmentalists are wary that Mexican pollution laws - which are neither well-enforced nor harshly punitive - will make Mexico a haven for companies that do not want to abide by the United States' stricter pollution laws.

William Cavitt, director of the Office of Canada in the U.S. Department of Commerce, said the Canadian trade agreement serves as a precedent and may even be a model for the trilateral agreement.

The representatives of Mexico, the United States and Canada will discuss the trilateral trade agreement tonight at the World Lecture Series panel discussion at 8 in Rudder Auditorium.
