### IRS offers tax-filing assistance

## Return deadline nears

WASHINGTON (AP) — The deadline nears. The IRS waits. The taxpayer panics.

It's a taxing time for all Americans, but especially for the millions who have waited until the last minute to file their 1990 federal tax returns — and for Postal Service and IRS employees who have to deal with the annual April 15 onslaught.

The Internal Revenue Service expects to receive 27 million returns at its 10 processing centers

this week — nearly one of every four that will be filed this year.

Most people must file by midnight Monday, but several million will take longer.

The IRS said many of its offices and its toll-free telephone number — 1-800-829-1040 — would remain open into the evening to answer taxpayer questions. But don't expect instant service; repeated tries often are required in the best of times to get through to an IRS operator.

Many post offices, especially in metropolitan areas, will station clerks outside to allow motorists to drop off returns without leaving their cars.

The IRS will send volunteers inside the lobby of the Milwaukee Post Office to fill out simple returns and offer advice on the more complicated returns. Anyone in the Los Angeles basin will be able to determine the closest post office open until midnight by dialing a special number.

To sign up for any of the TAMU Outdoor adventures, stop in at the Recreational Sports Office in 159 Read Building. If you have any questions concerning the TAMU Outdoors program, feel free to call Patsy at 845-7826.

**Canoe Trip:** The San Marcos River is spring-fed and remains a constant 72 degrees year round. Enjoy spending the weekend paddling this scenic Texas Hill Country River with TAMU Outdoors. **Registration ends today!** The cost is \$40 (\$45 for non A&M) and is limited to 12 participants.

**Introduction to Hang Gliding:** Enjoy the beauty and freedom of this spectacular sport! USHGA certified instructors will present this weekend course. **Registration ends today!** The cost is \$75 (\$82 for non A&M).

**Windsurfing:** Take the weekend off and learn the fundamentals of kayaking in a two day class offered by TAMU Outdoors. The class will be taught by American Canoe Association certified instructors. The first day includes an introduction to kayak strokes, rescue and the eskimo roll. The second day will be spent on the San Marcos River learning how to paddle the boat and get a feel for whitewater. **Family Camping Trip:** Join TAMU Outdoors in a camping trip geared specifically for families. Activities available at the park include hiking, playground, and an unsupervised swimming area. Canoes, flat bottom boats and paddle boats may be rented from the boat house. A miniature gold course is also located in the park.
