Board of Regents feel they cannot use available University money, permanent University bond funds or other money to fund a luxury," he said. "It is your decision whether you want the luxury. The decision is simple. Do you want to pay \$50 a semester and do you want to see Aggies pay it for the next 20 years for a very nice facility? Or do you want to keep your money for something else?"

Other students said they were active in intramurals or other recreational sports and are willing to pay the additional \$15 to have the better facility. One student said that he

thinks construction of the facility is long overdue and giving students another chance to vote on the fee increase will just be a waste of time because students will give overwhelming approval.

One graduate student questioned whether students taking only one class or part-time students will have to pay the flat \$50 fee every semester also.

Ogden said every student would have to pay the fee.

"That \$50 fee entitles students taking one (credit) hour or \$20 (credit) hours to use the facility just as much as anyone else,"

Ogden said. "There's no relationship between the number of hours you are taking and how often you are using the facility."

Ogden said varying the fee to compensate for part-time students is a problem because A&M has to sell bonds to pay for the facility.

"You have to have some sort of revenue source that guarantees the payment of the bond," he said. "If the payment of the facility is deferred until it is completed, A&M probably would not be able to raise the revenue it needs." The 1989 bill said the fee

would not go into effect until the facility was open, but Ogden was unsure if this still was the case since the current bill does not state that.

Ogden said he was not trying to talk students out of approving the fee and is willing to help get the bill passed as long as he is confident students really want the facility and know what the fee entails.

"I have not made a final decision yet," Ogden said. "But my sense is that students want to build a recreational sports facility and they want to build (it) as fast as they can, and we should go ahead and get it passed."

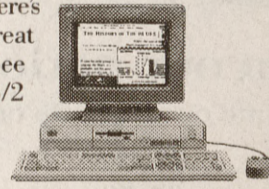

**JFK movie
re-enacts
1963 death**

DALLAS (AP) — The scene Dallas has spent decades trying to forget — that of a president assassinated as his motorcade went past — is being played out again, this time in front of movie cameras.

"JFK," Academy Award-winning director Oliver Stone's account of President John F. Kennedy's 1963 assassination, began filming this week with the re-enactment of the slaying in Dealey Plaza.

Filming, which began Monday, brought out hundreds of the curious, some still fascinated by the slaying.

"I flew in from Maryland to see this because when is it ever going to look like this again?" Peggy Higgins said Tuesday as she motioned toward the Texas School Book Depository where, according to the Warren Commission, Lee Harvey Oswald fired the fatal shots as Kennedy's motorcade passed.

"The amazing thing is that the 25 or so years since the assassination, the controversy has never gone away," she said.

Go away is just what some Dallas — which was nicknamed "the city of hate" for a time after the assassination — would like the memory to do.

"You know, Dallas has tried for 28 years to live this thing down, and here they are rehashing it," said Jack Cardwell, who was in Dealey Plaza for a business appointment. "It's something a lot of us would like to get."

Southern Methodist University film professor Martin Jurney said, "While we want movie pictures to come to Dallas and appreciate the sums of money that are spent, it is still a little bit of a heartbreak to wonder whether or not Dallas might be accused in some fashion."

In "JFK," Stone's attention to detail has turned Dealey Plaza into a replica of what it was Nov. 22, 1963.
