Lady Aggies, Young dominate SWT

Missy Young is queen of the hill. The softball hill, that is. By picking up 1-0 and 8-0 victories in Thursday's doubleheader for the Lady Aggies against Southwest Texas State, Young reached the 30-win plateau for the season. The Bobcats dropped to 16-30 for the year. The first shutout for the Lady Ags (40-12) was an extra-inning pitcher's duel until the ninth. Dawn Wuthrich started things off with a bunt single off Bobcat loser Karen Taylor. After Michelle Mayfield reached on an error that pushed Wuthrich to second, Jennifer McFalls singled home the winning run. Lady Aggie starting pitcher Dana Mitchell went seven and one-third innings, scattering five hits and walking one. She was relieved by Young in the eighth with one out and received a no-decision. "We've worked really hard the last few days, and you can really see it," said Lady Aggie head coach Bob Brock. "It's a shame that Dana pitched so well the first game and we can't seem to get any runs. The bats started making noise early in Game Two, complementing a no-hitter by Young."

Mayfield had a one-out bunt single in the first to get the ball rolling. McFalls doubled to send Mayfield home for a 1-0 lead. Meanwhile, Young struck two out in the first to start her dominance. The second inning saw Rhonda Halpert single before two outs later, Barbara Kajs singled to put runners at first and second. A two-run error by Bobcat first-baseman Terrie Keeling made the lead 3-0. In the third, McFalls singled and moved to second on a Bobcat error on a Karen Kalhoefer ground ball. The runners tagged to second and third on a fly out by Halpert. Stacey Lucas then singled to bring the runners home for a 5-0 lead. The onslaught ended in the sixth with the Aggies scoring three more runs. The Bobcats decided not to continue the game in the sixth and are now 1-25 against the Lady Ags in the series. Young ended her no-hitter with eight strikeouts in six innings. "I'm always pleased with a no-hitter," Young said. "I felt pretty good all the way." "Missy was able to rest," Brock said. "She had a little bit of a sore arm and she came back and threw real strong."

New coaches adjusting to Aggie system

Three new coaches are spending spring practice adjusting to A&M while their players are busy adjusting to them. David Culley, Shawn Slocum and Trent Walters are three new faces on Texas A&M head football coach R.C. Slocum's revamped coaching staff. Culley will fill the gap at receiver coach, Walters will work with the secondary, and the young Slocum will work with the tight ends. Slocum said it won't take long for the three new coaches to get comfortable with the team. "With football coaches, the kind of guys we hire here, it's a matter of converting terminology," the elder Slocum said. "They know the plays that we run."

Culley came to A&M from the University of Texas-El Paso. He considers the change a good career move. "This is a unique place, a wonderful place," Culley said. "In this profession you want to get to the point where every time you go out to play a game you have a chance to win — this is one of the few places." The new coach has one of the hardest tasks during spring —

putting together a receiver core that has a total of one season of experience among them. He recalled the first day he saw improvement in one of his players — redshirt freshman Brian Mitchell. "That was the first time since I've been here I felt like I had coached, like I had earned my money," he said. Culley looks for consistency while teaching the fundamentals.

"At UTEP I always had guys with experience, I didn't have to coach them," he explained. "I just made sure I didn't mess them up." Walters coached at University of Louisville before moving to Aggieland almost three weeks ago. "I'm pleased with the players development," Walters said. "They had to accustom themselves to a new defensive backs coach, and I had to learn them."

Walters said a coaching philosophy based on his military background should fit in well at A&M. "If we 'prepare proper prior planning, it will prevent poor performance.'" Effort is the secret to Shawn Slocum's coaching philosophy. "Whether you play on offense, defense, special teams, it takes ultimate effort," Slocum said. "Effort is bottomline." Slocum took the job under his father after coaching at Pittsburgh. He said working for his father was no different than working for anyone else. "He's dad when I see him on the field," he said. "But when it's time to work, he's the best." The younger Slocum is a 1988 graduate of A&M. Taking the job here was like coming home for him. "It's really a lot of fun because I bleed maroon," Slocum said. "I want to do a good job, but being at A&M makes it something special." Slocum doesn't mind being the youngest coach on the staff because he can learn from the other coaches' years of experience. "That's where it's beneficial to me," he said. "I learn something new everyday."
