


**Gorbachev: New treaty should help unions**  
 TOKYO (AP) — Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev said Thursday night he will try to hammer out a new union treaty with just nine of the 15 Soviet republics, giving up at least temporarily on six independence-minded republics.  
 "We shall have the treaty signed by those who are prepared to do so," Gorbachev told a press conference after his summit meeting with Japanese Prime Minister Toshiki Kaifu.

what they have done for me. Tolentino said. "It's reciprocal. Alumni can give this school an excellent name and be instrumental in securing more funds. I want to give th'A&M medical school for other minority students. Maldonado also sees the college's summer enrichment programs, which include a week-long program to familiarize high school students with the medical school environment and an eight-week hospital research apprentice program.

"I think our size has a lot to do with our success," Maldonado said. "And our faculty is accessible to the students. It's a lot easier with 48 students than with 200."

Denton said he is confident the information and understanding gained during his visit will facilitate the formulation of recommendations to help other schools.

Fifteen minority or disadvantaged students will participate in the Bridge to Medicine, which introduces college students to the Medical College Admission Test, the admissions process and life in medical school.

About 60 percent of the program's past students have entered a medical school program, Maldonado said. Most of the remaining students have either entered other health related professions, continued their education in other health fields, or are trying to improve their MCAT scores or gain admission to medical school.
