Ex-lawmakers spend surplus donation funds to aid lobbying careers

HOUSTON (AP) — Politicians who leave the Legislature to become lobbyists are legally taking their campaign surpluses with them to fund trips, meals, entertainment and even the campaigns of other politicians. The Houston Post said in a Monday story that reports filed in Austin by ex-lawmakers show they have funneled leftover campaign donations to legislators they now lobby in addition to using the funds to pay for trips, gifts, entertainment and contributions to private universities. Among former legislators named in the story are former Sens. Grant Jones of Temple, Ray Farabee of Wichita Falls and Ed Howard of Texarkana and former Reps. Charles Evans of Hurst, Cliff Johnson of Palestine, Mike Toomey of Houston and Gary Thompson of Abilene. The practice, though legal, has been branded "inappropriate" by Secretary of State John Hannah and has raised the ire of government watchdog groups like Common Cause. "It subverts the system," said Mary Nell Mathis, issues chair for Common Cause. "It's almost a laundering operation." Tom Smith of Public Citizen, another watchdog group, said ex-legislators who become lobbyists expect something in return when they take money that had been contributed to them and pass it on to other politicians. "They can use this money to enhance their position as a lobbyist by making contributions to members who are in trouble" in an election, Smith said. "It's a favor that has to be returned, and often is in votes" in the House or Senate, he said. Hannah, Gov. Ann Richards' point man on ethics reform, said "I guess the perfect law would require that it be given back pro rata to the people who contributed it." But talk of revising laws plus spending laws were squelched early in the legislative session. Smith said: "They come in money that as their money — money they can live on to meet their expenses while an official holder. When you begin to talk to them about limiting what they can do with the money once they retire, they guard it very jealously." Under a 1983 law that placed tighter restrictions on spending leftover political money, ex-legislators are allowed to keep collecting and spending money as long as they have a campaign treasurer. When they drop treasurer, collections must be turned but spending can continue for six years. The money can be spent on contributions to political parties, candidates, the state schools and tax-exempt organizations. Jones, a 24-year veteran of the Legislature and current lobbyist, said he sees nothing wrong with the way he has spent \$165,000 in leftover campaign funds since 1988.
