

conceptual spaces so that they could be manipulated by local ar-

Most of the students' models were designed so families could interact with each other and lean on each other for moral support instead of remaining isolated in their rooms.

"The main idea behind the house is to get people out of the separate rooms into a large communal area," Deeny said. "We tried to have all of these activities near the center of the house and the sleeping areas on the perime-

Guerra said the reality of the project gave students boundaries on extravagance.


He said students had to keep a fairly low cost in mind when working on the project because the houses are built solely on donated funds.

Private launch site poised to monopolize polar research market

"It's as though the universe has contrived to put us in the right place at the right time," said Glenn Olds, commissioner of the state Department of Com-merce and Economic Development.

'We should be closing a deal on the funding and so on in the next few months," Olds said. "We brought one of the big fi-nancial people and several others from a commercial satellite company up here. ... Their minds were boggled.
