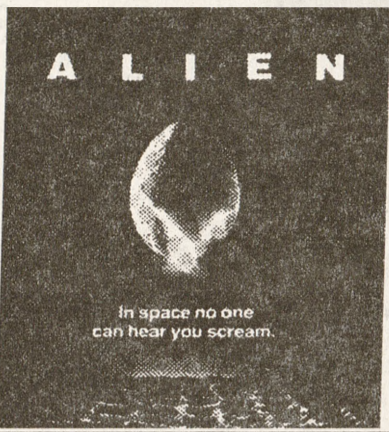

out student regent legislation in his argument, McHargue said.

"Barrientos said states like California and Illinois have the legislation and some great schools," McHargue said. "Then he listed states without student regent legislation like Idaho and Mississippi and said, 'Look at the company Texas is in.'"

McHargue questioned the feasibility of student regents taking office by the Fall 1991 semester. He said appointments for Spring 1992 are much more likely.

He said Sen. Turner supports student representation at state universities but will wait to see how the provision works before considering adding voting privileges.

"I've seen student regent bills go down in flames for years," he said. "Voting was often the stumbling block for many legislators."

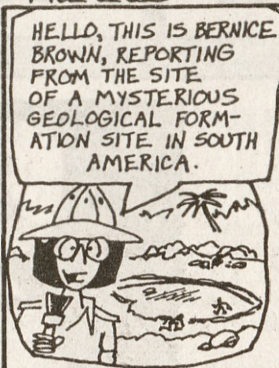
"Many were won over by the non-voting provision, though," he added. "What we did today was quite extraordinary, but we don't want to get ahead of ourselves."

Uneducated workers receive risky jobs at chemical plants, study reveals

WASHINGTON (AP) — Some of the most risky and hazardous work in the petrochemical industry is being assigned to inexperienced and uneducated contract workers who may have trouble understanding English, said a study Tuesday prompted by a plant explosion that killed 23 people.

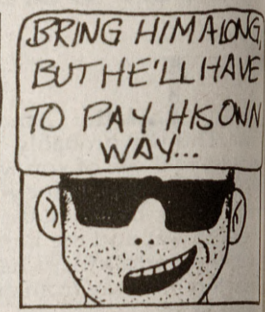
"The least prepared workers in the petrochemical industry are often performing some of its most dangerous work and experiencing a significantly higher proportion of injuries than their more experienced direct-hire counterparts," the study said.

Specialists look for MIAs in Cambodia

WASHINGTON (AP) — American specialists are expected to make their first-ever visit to Cambodia Wednesday to investigate the whereabouts of 83 Americans still unaccounted for since the Indochina War, the State Department said Monday.

It is the first such mission to Cambodia since the American-backed regime there collapsed in April 1975.

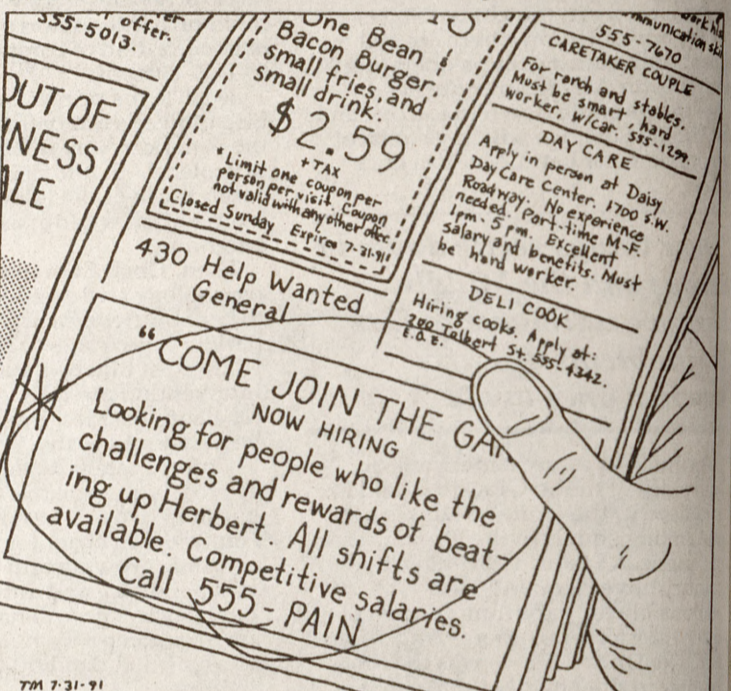
The visit was proposed several days ago by Deputy Assistant Secretary Kenneth Quinn during a visit to Laos where he met with the Cambodian ambassador.

The Phnom Penh government agreed, and the U.S. experts are scheduled to remain in the country for a week or two after their Wednesday arrival, the State Department said.

Instances of U.S. cooperation with Cambodia have been extremely rare since the communist takeover of the country 16 years ago.

Reports recommend increasing tuition

inspection team is set to look at the vet school again Sept. 9 and 10 and decide on accreditation.

A tuition increase is also a possibility at the vet school, Shadduck said.

"We don't know for sure, but it may be coming," he said. "The Sharp report recommends it be raised. But tuition has been raised twelve-fold in the last six years, and it doesn't seem right."

State Comptroller John Sharp's Texas Performance Re-

view specifies severe budget cuts for programs throughout the state, including many in higher education.

Shadduck said A&M vet school students pay \$4,800 annually in tuition and the school receives \$34,000 from the state for each student. Medical students pay \$5,400 annually and the medical school gets \$54,000 per student from the state.

"So, while our tuition is slightly under that of medical students, we receive far less from the state," he said.

NASA reschedules lift off

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — NASA's countdown clock started ticking again for the launch of space shuttle Atlantis after it was grounded for more than a week by a faulty engine computer.

Atlantis is scheduled to lift off at 11:01 a.m. Thursday on a nine-day mission to put a communications satellite into orbit. The countdown began Monday.

"Everything's going well right now," test director Mike Leimbach said Tuesday. "We're not tracking any problems that would prevent us from getting to a launch attempt Thursday morning."

Even the weather outlook was favorable. Forecasters put the odds of good weather Thursday at 80 percent.

Atlantis' first countdown was halted hours before liftoff Wednesday after the computer that controls one of the three main engines failed. The \$4 million component was replaced with a spare, NASA said.

Technicians also installed a new data-transmitting unit on another engine because the old one was unreliable, NASA said.

Districts established to equalize taxation

districts to help distribute revenue to poorer school districts in the state.

"The county education districts were set up to get money from rich school districts," Winn said.

David Neal, assistant superintendent for business for the College Station School District, said CoEds were set up to create a way to collect property tax.

"This is a mechanism used to accomplish a purpose," Neal said.

Under the Texas constitution,

the state cannot take tax money from one district and give it to another. The county education districts combine these areas into a single district which is the taxable.

CoEds under S.B. 351 were drawn so each district has approximately equal wealth per student, Moore said. The districts inject more revenue into the Texas school system.

S.B. 351 was the legislature's response to the series of court decisions overturning previous school finance reform efforts, she said.
