AIDS. "It is imperative that we remove
these legal barriers so that the trans-
mission of HIV can be lessened for
those who cannot stop injecting
drugs," the commission said.
"National drug policy must recog-
nize the success of outreach programs
which link needleeexchange and
bleach distribution programs with
drug treatment," the report said.
Bleach can kill the AIDS virus on con-
taminated needles.
The commission said such programs
