Government ignores AIDS and drug use link, report says

WASHINGTON (AP) — A federal commission said Tuesday the government is failing to confront the deadly link between the twin epidemics of drug addiction and AIDS because of its "myopic" punitive approach to intra-venous drug users.

The National Commission on AIDS said a third of all recent AIDS cases are related to intravenous drug use, yet federal agencies "have barely recognized the linkages."

The prescription requirement, it said, merely encourages the sharing of contaminated needles, thus increasing the risk of transmission of the human immunodeficiency virus that causes

'National drug policy must recognize the success of outreach programs which link needle-exchange and bleach-distribution programs with drug treatment," the report said. Bleach can kill the AIDS virus on contaminated needles.

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (AP) — NCNB Corp. and C&S Sovran Corp. Tuesday unveiled a \$10 billion, 10-year lending plan for low-income areas in states where the two banks will operate after

merging to create NationsBank.

C&S Sovran Chairman Bennett Brown and NCNB's Hugh McColl announced the plan at a news conference in Charlotte, calling it the largest community development by a U.S. bank.

"Ten billion dollars is a goal we plan to exceed," McColl said. "As soon as we get to that level, we intend to beat it. It will take a lot of loans. The largest community lending plan to date was a \$5 billion plan by the Bank of America, they

The program will target consumer and commercial affordable housing loans. It will include residential and small- and minority-owned businesses. Also covered by the program will be public and private partnerships and loans to nonprofit groups, government agencies and other programs serving low- to moderate-income neighborhoods.

The program's goal is to reach people who missed out on the economic boom of the 1980s,

"Historically, a segment of our country's population has been denied access to credit," he said. That is especially true in the region NationsBank will serve. From Baltimore south to Miami and west to El Paso, economically disadvantaged segments of the population have been left on the sidelines of economic progress. The financial muscle of NationsBank will help change that."

Both Brown and McColl denied that the ambitious program was spurred by the threat of protests from community activists that could have delayed or threatened the merger of their two banks into NationsBank.

No formal protests have been filed against the proposed merger. But low-income housing activists in Atlanta and Charlotte said earlier they were considering that possibility.

Kidnappers offer meeting U.N. leader could

negotiate release

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) -Kidnappers holding two American hostages said Tuesday they would send a "special envoy" to the U.N. secretary-general within 48 hours in a bid to break the hostage deadlock.

The announcement came in a statement from Islamic Jihad, or Islamic Holy War, the pro-Iranian Shiite Moslem group that abducted Americans Terry Anderson and Thomas Sutherland in 1985. A photograph of Anderson accompanied the statement.

U.N. Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar said in New York Tuesday night that he had not been contacted by Islamic lihad but was willing to meet any emissary.

A Bush administration offi-

cial said Tuesday night there

have been growing indications of a hostage release from a variety of channels. The official, who spoke on condition of anonymity, admitted that expectations had been raised in the past but said the current reports seemed more substantial than usual.

Asked whether there have been talks with Islamic Jihad, Perez de Cuellar said, "It's a very delicate subject," but he declined to confirm or deny any such talks. Perez de Cuellar heads to Geneva this weekend on an unrelated matter, but spokeswoman Nadia Younes refused to say if he would discuss the hostage issue there.

Anderson's sister, Peggy Say, said the U.S. State Department notified families of American captives on Monday of a possible hostage release.

lissa Small, an assistant editor. "We thought we should inform our readers of this," Small said.

wrote in the letter, which was "Some people can be allergic to it." The letters urge readers to immediately "block out the reference to '1/4 teaspoon wintergreen oil (available at some pharmacies),'

to make sure no one uses it. They include a sticker of the corrected recipe and suggest it be pasted over the original.

Writer Helen Gustafson had called for wintergreen extract for the cookies she'd eat with lemonade while visiting her Aunt Vertie's Nebraska farm as a child.
