**Jackson leads Sox over Royals, 11-2**

CHICAGO (AP) — Bo Jackson drove in three runs with his first two major-league hits since his return from a crippling hip injury, and the Chicago White Sox scored 10 runs in the fourth inning for an 11-2 victory over the Kansas City Royals Thursday.

Charlie Hough (8-8) gave up seven hits in eight innings.

In the fourth, Robin Ventura and Warren Newson had RBI singles before Jackson's two-run single chased starter Mark Gubicza (8-8).

Reliever Mark Davis walked the next three batters, bringing in two more runs.

Ozzie Guillen greeted Storm Davis with a his first career grand slam home run.

The inning was Chicago's biggest since the White Sox scored 11 runs in one inning on Oct. 3, 1987 against the Oakland A's.

**Courier defeats Sampras in Open**

NEW YORK (AP) — Jim Courier knocked off friend and willing foil Pete Sampras, the brooding defending champion, to reach the U.S. Open semifinals.

Courier, 21, the surprise French Open champion over Andre Agassi, ascended to the top rank of the new generation of American men's players with his 6-2, 7-6 (7-4), 7-6, (7-5) victory over Sampras on Thursday. Courier will play the winner of the Jimmy Connors-Paul Haarhuis quarterfinal night match.

The only men's semifinalist not to drop a set in five matches, Courier took target practice at Sampras with forehands that seemed shot out of a cannon and serves that kicked by for 14 aces, including the winning points in the first and second sets.

Courier yielded only three points on serve in the first set, eight in the second and 10 in the third. Sampras managed but one break point the entire match, in the fifth game of the third set.

"I am in the semis at the U.S. Open. Why should I worry about anything?"

"Life doesn't get much better than this," he said.

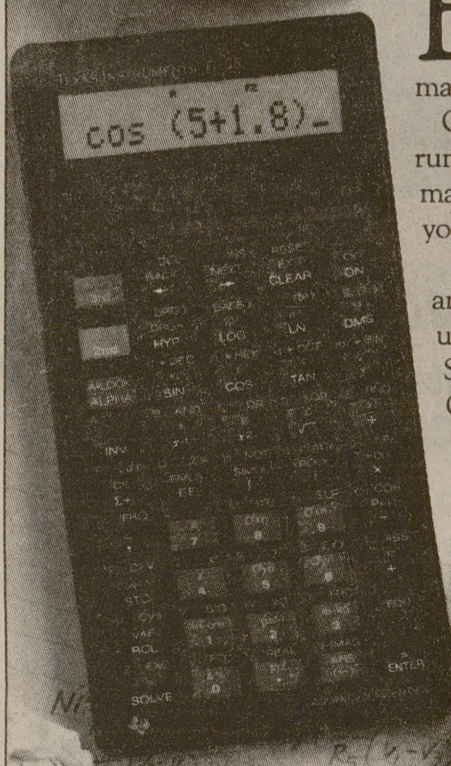
Awkward on his approach, confused about when to come and when to stay back, Sampras sulked and shrugged his way through the match while Courier prowled the baseline and blasted winners.

Courier rushed the net only a few times, about a third as many times as Sampras, but picked his opportunities carefully, volleyed with confidence and authority and played away 22 winners when he came to just a little bit. So maybe I can't really bear down and concentrate, Sampras said.

Courier jumped on Sampras, serves to break him twice in the first set, in the fifth and seventh games, then waited for his opportunities in the tiebreakers after each held service throughout the second and third sets.

Sampras could do nothing with Courier's serves and barely held his own. He escaped one match point on his serve in the 10th game, but not in the tiebreaker.
