The men's team, competing against Stephen F. Austin State University, won 18 to 42, while the women's team defeated the University of Houston by a score

The score is determined the the order of the top five finishers on each team. The higher the place of finish, the lower the score.

Cross country coach Ed Marcinkiewicz said he was happy with the teams' performance.

"I'm very pleased, particularly with the guys" said Marcinkiewicz. "We had some guys like Drew Stooksberry and Jason Reed who ran phenomenally

Juniors Scott Garvin and Ross Stooksberry, running a four mile race, tied for first place in the men's division with a time of 19 minutes, 42 seconds. Marcikiewicz said he knew he could

In the two-mile women's race, junior Melissa Weaver crossed the finish line first with a time of 10:43. Stacey Ware and Connie Hand finished second and third with times of 10:43 and 11:01.

"The girl's team was almost a carbon copy of the guy's," Marcinkiewicz said.
Marcinkiewicz said he was especially happy with the top three finishers.


