ANNUAL COMPETITION FOR FULBRIGHT GRANTS TO CLOSE SOON
The 1992-93 competition for Fulbright Grants for graduate study abroad will close on October 7, 1991. Only a few more weeks remain in which to submit your draft proposal and meet with the Study Abroad Director. Qualified graduate students must meet with the Study Abroad Director before September 25 to allow ample time for proposal revision.

Most of the grants offered provide round-trip transportation, tuition and maintenance for one academic year; a few provide international travel only, or a stipend intended as a partial grant-in-aid.

Applicants must meet the following requirements:

- be a U.S. citizen at the time of application;
- hold a bachelor's degree or its equivalent before the beginning date of the grant;
- be proficient in the language of the host country;
- must not hold a Ph.D at the time of application.

Application forms and further information for students currently enrolled in Texas A&M University may be obtained from the TAMU Study Abroad Office, which is located at 161 Bizzell Hall West, 845-0544.

Note: The deadline for interviews is September 25, 1991.
The deadline for application is Monday, October 7, 1991.

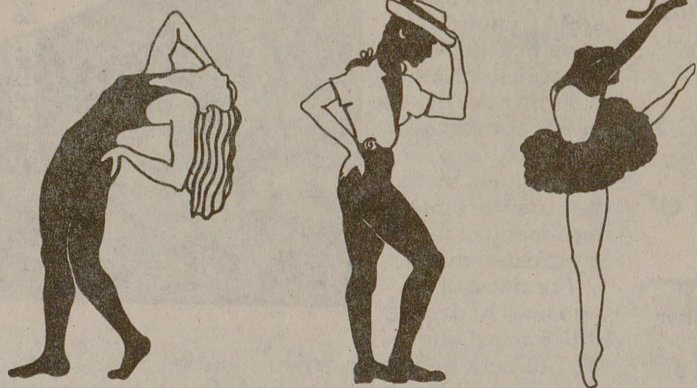

limit will apply. "Under extenuating circumstances, deans can authorize an extra Q-grade," Carter said.

Jean Ranieski, assistant to the dean for the College of Liberal Arts and coordinator for undergraduate studies, said that because Liberal Arts students were not previously restricted concerning Q-drops, they will be allowed three drops beginning this semester.

"Liberal Arts students have never been told to use their Q-drops wisely, until now," she said.

However, she said, students who transfer to Liberal Arts from a college that already restricted Q-drops will be allowed to Q-drop only the amount that reaches the new limit.

Because Liberal Arts students have three drops at their disposal, she said that they shouldn't encounter the problem of needing extra Q-drops.

"Any drop involving extenuating circumstances or an appeal that a drop shouldn't be classified as a Q-drop goes to the dean," she

would do yet; in Las Vegas, Nevada state NOW president Naomi Millisor said her feelings was a protest was premature.

"I think it's inappropriate at this time, because he's still indicted, not convicted," Millisor said. "With all the violence and rape and battering of women, important these celebrity things come out, but he's still not convicted."

One potential target for a boycott would be the pay-per-view sales, which are projected to be the \$55 million record set by the Holyfield-George Foreman fight.

Ross Levinson, a spokesman for the fight's pay-per-view TVKO, said her organization not received any protest threats.

"It was obvious in the way media played it," said Judith Condo, the head of Albany County Rape Crisis in upstate New York. Tyson started his boxing career in the area.

"It was a lot of 'He's not the kind of guy,' little kids being asked, 'Who is he?' and saying 'He's my hero,'" Condo said. "testifies to a popular notion that rape doesn't leave long-term damage, which is erroneous."

Tyson was recently accused of fondling other beauty contestants in 1988, he allegedly did the same thing to two women in a New York nightclub. One of those women who claimed Tyson grabbed her breasts and behind, won \$100,000 damages in a civil lawsuit against Tyson last year.

Tyson also allegedly battered his former wife, Robin Givens

"Students think this is a punishment," she said. "But in the long run, it will help them."

Dr. Dan Turner, associate dean for the College of Engineering, said engineering only permits one or two Q-drops in the past.

He said he would allow more than three Q-drops now, but only if circumstances justify them.

Turner said that the new drop procedure will be much easier on the deans.

"It's going to take a lot of pressure off of us, because we won't have students saying 'I need to Q-drop after the deadline because they didn't know the status in the course earlier,'" said.

Dr. Ken Poenisch, assistant dean for student affairs for the College of Science, said that science students had no Q-drop limit before. He said science students could only get more than three drops if there was a legitimate reason beyond the student's control.

"We're going to make better use of the class spaces we have," Poenisch said.
