# Fishing holes for the amateurs and the pros

If hunting's out, area offers two lakes to fish

D eing that the A in Texas A&M stands for Bagriculture, it would seem that it would be relatively easy to find someone willing to lease a few acres of farmland so that some college students can spend a morning shoot-ing at a couple of birds. But as I have found out through numerous phone calls this week, that is not the case

As I promised last week, I have received some information on local fishing guides, but I am having trouble with the hunting part. There are not too many people willing to turn their pastures over to a bunch of college kids

with shotguns. The closest day-hunting seems to be in the Katy-Brookshire area. Most of these outfitters advertise in the Houston newspapers and usually run from 15 to 30 dollars per half day. One of these operations, called Paddlefoot Places, has land around Monaville, just outside of Hempstead. This is only about a one hour drive, which is not too bad if you have someone to keep you awake on the way home.

Fishing on public water, however, is a whole different story. We have two major lakes within a 30-minute drive from College Station, one of which will surely suit your needs

Lake Somerville tends to be a more of a 'recreation area" while Gibbons Creek is more for the serious angler in pursuit of largemouth



Somerville is a popular weekend spot for-both waterskiiers and fishermen. With the large area this lake covers, fishermen can pull into one of the numerous coves and get away from the weekend boat traffic. If you do not own a boat but still want to do some good fishing, the spillway on the lower end can produce nice catches of stripers and catfish when the gates are open.

There are several ramps to launch a boat and plenty of places around the lake to spend a few hours in the sun. If you wish to spend the night at the lake, there are some nice state parks with excellent campsights and clean restrooms.

Gibbons Creek, on the other hand caters strictly to fishermen. It has nothing fancy outside of a lake, launch ramp, some portable toilets, and a pavilion to have lunch on. Other than all that, you do what you came for - catch quality fish.

There is one store near the lake which has everything you should need for a day on the water. The Carlos store has gas, tackle, bait, and beer. Since there are no marinas on the lake, make sure you have all of your supplies before launching.

There are several guides that fish Gibbons Creek almost exclusively. As I mentioned last week, if you really want to find some good places to fish, a quality guide is the way to go. Most of these guys are on the water more than they are home so they know where the fish are and what they want for dinner.

#### Redskins' kicker named NFC offensive player of week

IRVING, (AP) – The Washington Red-skins have 197 reasons why they are tied for the NFC East lead.

They got 197 yards worth of field goals from Chip Lohmiller in Monday night's 33-31 victory over the Dallas Cowboys

"Lohmiller killed us," said Dallas coach Jimmy Johnson. "I've never seen a hotter kicker. We got beat by a kicker who had the game of his career.'

Lohmiller, who led the NFC in field goals with 30 last year, had kicks of 53, 52, 45 and 47 yards. He tied an NFL record with two field goals of 50 yards or more in a single game. Lohmiller on Wednesday was named the

NFC's offensive player of the week, only the third kicker ever to earn that honor.

"This ranks right up there with the five field goals I kicked against Buffalo last year," Lohmiller said. "This has to be one of the best days of my life in football." Washington had a big edge in the kicking game over Dallas.

Kelvin Martin fumbled a punt that Wash-ington turned into a touchdown and the Red-skins parlayed a fake punt into the go-ahead touchdown.

"I felt like I would have a good game in the warmups," Lohmiller said. "Normally you can tell how you're hitting it in warmups. Playing Dallas gives you a little more pop in your kicks. The footballs seemed to take off like balls that had been broken in.

Lohmiller's kicks were traveling way above the crossbar.

"My range is out to 55 yards," he said. "Of course, the good thing about Texas Stadium is that you don't have to worry about the wind. There isn't any.

Lohmiller, who played collegiately at Minnesota, led the NFC in points scored with 131 last year.


