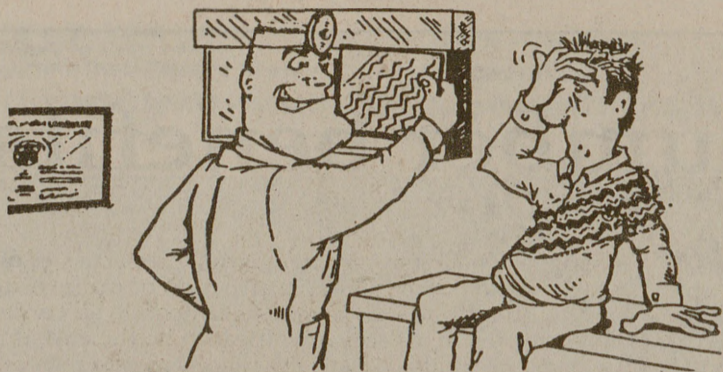

Aggie Freshmen mark debut at Kyle Field with stellar performances

Thomas, Biggens part of 45-7 win over Louisiana State

The Aggies won big over Louisiana State on Saturday, but left Kyle Field far from unscathed.

With 7:00 left in the first quarter senior quarterback Bucky Richardson left the game with a foot injury.

Junior Kent Petty and red-shirt freshman Jeff Granger lead the Aggies the rest of the way. Granger completed 5-of-8 passes for 89 yards, including one touchdown. Petty was 1-of-4 for 46 yards.

Richardson's playing status is day-to-day with a sprained arch in his right foot.

Granger said he didn't feel any pressure before the game, because he wasn't expecting to play, he said.

"Everyone was asking me today if I was nervous, and truthfully I wasn't expecting to be in," Granger said. "I was expecting Bucky to go out there and have a great game. I expected maybe one or two snaps today and when I went out there my stomach started shaking and I was real nervous."

The backups always have to be ready, Petty said.

"At first I thought it was nothing because he's a tough guy and would shake it off," Petty said. "But when I knew I had to go in and play, I just took a deep breath and tried to stay ready."

"If we (the two quarterbacks) just play mistake free football and just not hurt the team, I think that's our job. Jeff and I aren't asked to do the same things Bucky is, but coach expects us to be ready."

Richardson thought the team performed well in his absence.

"They did fine without me," Richardson said. "I've said before, people are looking at me like I've got to carry the weight of this team on offense. As you saw today, that's not the case. I think now people will maybe not con-

centrate on me so much and at guys like Greg (Hill) and Doug Carter and Rodney Thomas and Wilbert Biggens to carry the ball."

A number of other injuries forced the A&M coaching staff to call on young players.

Three plays after Richardson left the game, junior fullback Doug Carter left the game with a sprained ankle. Freshman tailback Cliff Groce rushed for 64 yards on four carries and caught two passes for 27 yards on Carter's spot.

One of Groce's catches was a 5-yard touchdown grab from Granger.

"It was really exciting in the end zone and everybody was saying, 'you're running, you're already in the end zone, just wanted to get in there.'"

And with 14:10 left in the second quarter, senior tailback Randy Simmons strained his knee while making a 6-yard touchdown dive. Freshman Rodney Thomas became the backup tailback behind star Greg Hill.

Thomas was nervous about playing but overcame it by rushing for 81 yards on 12 carries.

"I was very nervous," Thomas said. "As a high school player to come into college sports that's overwhelming. I just have to believe in yourself."

For Thomas the call came without warning.

"I was just sitting on the sideline and coach said 'Rodney, get in there.' I said, 'alright.' I was a little nervous, but it's a great feeling to get into it."

Carter and Simmons are expected to be ready for Saturday's game against Tulsa. Richardson and McAfee are listed as probable.

Despite problems holding onto the ball, freshman Wilbert Biggens returned five punts for 52 yards, including a long 27. Biggens also ran for 53 yards on two tries as the Aggies' kick returner.

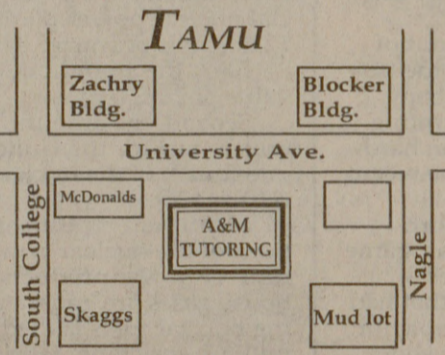

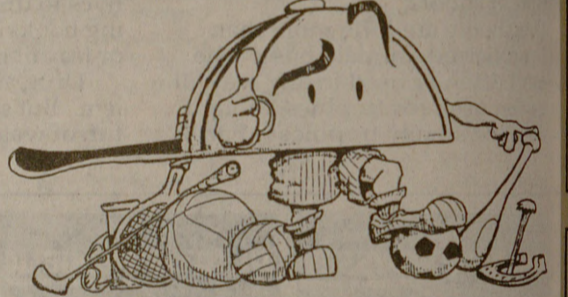
