As the final seconds rolled off the gameclock Saturday night, the A&M football team walked onto the field and congratulated each other for their 34-7 victory over Southwestern Louisiana.

Freshman Corps members chased Yell Leaders across the field, and fireworks went off in the sky above. It was a time for most to celebrate, but for others to re-

A&M football players Keith Waguespack, Terry Venetoulias, Reggie Graham, Jason Atkinson, and others kneeled in the middle of Kyle Field. They met to pray for the family of James Glenn, the freshman football player that col-lapsed and died Wednesday on

that very spot.

Earlier the team had gone about its business - staying focused and winning the football game - all the while wearing Glenn's No. 30 stamped on the back of their helmets.

Venetoulias, the Aggies' start-ing placekicker, had the best night

of his young A&M career. He kicked a career-long 43-

yard field goal in the first quarter, and later topped it with a 44-yard field goal at the end of the first

But the win was not enough to make up for the loss of a team-

Venetoulias and Glenn were friends in high school while standing on opposite sides of the field. Both met again at A&M and became as close as brothers, Venetoulias said.
