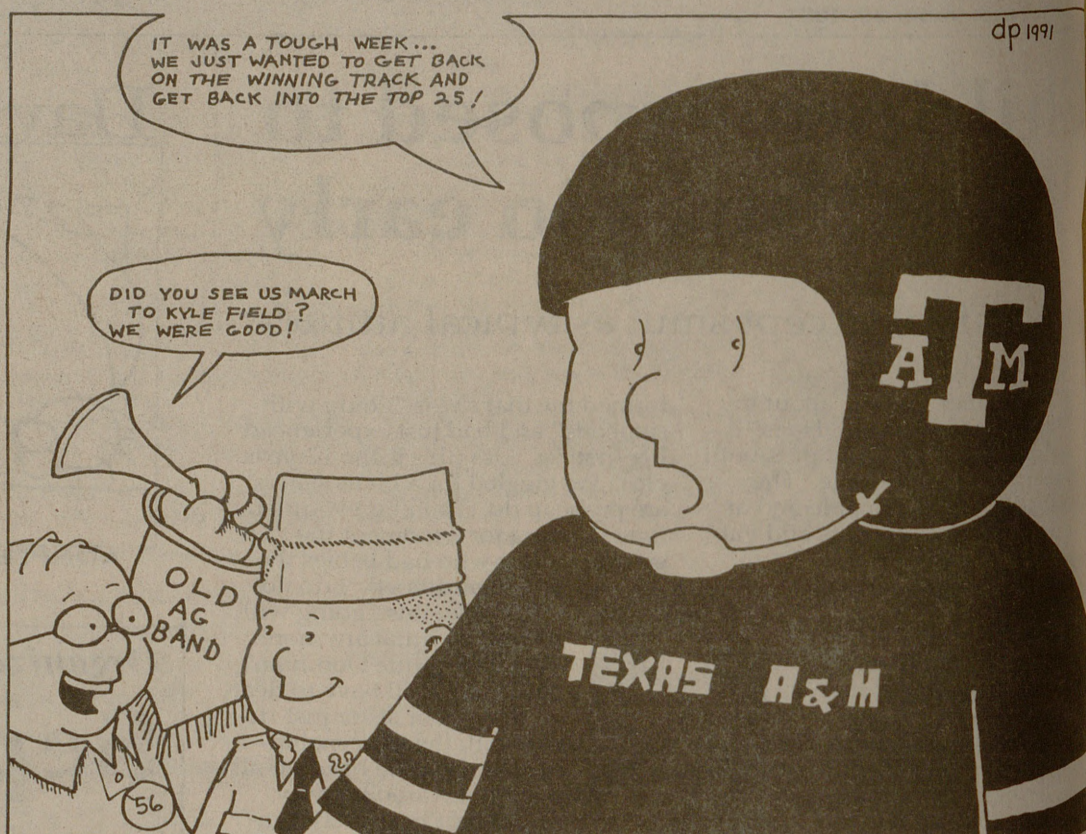

Aggies dedicate performance to teammate
'This one was for James'

As the final seconds rolled off the gameclock Saturday night, the A&M football team walked onto the field and congratulated each other for their 34-7 victory over Southwestern Louisiana.

Freshman Corps members chased Yell Leaders across the field, and fireworks went off in the sky above. It was a time for most to celebrate, but for others to remember.

A&M football players Keith Waguespack, Terry Venetoulis, Reggie Graham, Jason Atkinson, and others kneeled in the middle of Kyle Field. They met to pray for the family of James Glenn, the freshman football player that collapsed and died Wednesday on that very spot.

Earlier the team had gone about its business - staying focused and winning the football game - all the while wearing Glenn's No. 30 stamped on the back of their helmets.

Venetoulis, the Aggies' starting placekicker, had the best night

of his young A&M career.

He kicked a career-long 43-yard field goal in the first quarter, and later topped it with a 44-yard field goal at the end of the first half.

But the win was not enough to make up for the loss of a teammate.

"This is probably one of the toughest weeks to ever get focused," Venetoulis said after the game. "I had one of my best friends pass away."

"I appreciate the whole team sticking by me - I was pretty down."

Venetoulis and Glenn were friends in high school while standing on opposite sides of the field. Both met again at A&M and became as close as brothers, Venetoulis said.

"Everybody's telling me he's in a better place and that some things are meant to be," he said. "I guess I'm just not mature enough to understand that - He was one of my best friends."

The kicker went through the same motions he always has, but this time the outcome meant a little more on the inside.

"I want to dedicate everything I do, every kick in every game, James Glenn," he explained. "I'm not going to let his memory die."

It had been a trying week for the whole team. But it also taught them a valuable lesson.

"Psychologically it's been a tough week for us - the strangling on and all of the dealing with the funeral and the loss of a teammate," Atkinson said. "But really given us a chance to pull together."

"The lord really blessed me, bouncing the ball our way and letting things come our way. We're really happy that we have another to lean on."

"It's a sad thing and this was for James and we're glad he could win it for him," said Richardson said.

Glenn was at Kyle Field Saturday - in spirit.

His name shows up in the national defensive statistics as assisting the team in making a tackle. His performance his family received the game ball from A&M team.

A part of James Glenn will never leave Kyle Field.

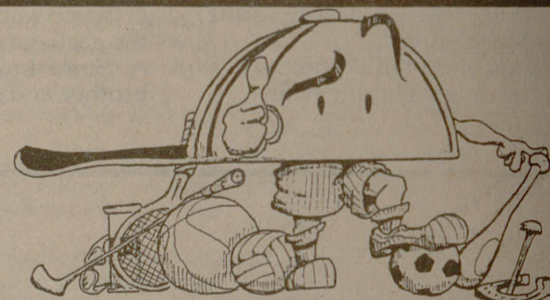
