

meet in a Nov. 16 runoff.

Louisiana's three largest newsapers - The Times-Picayune of New Orleans, the Baton Rouge Sunday Advocate, and The Times in Shreveport - endorsed Roemer on Sunday.

Both Duke and Edwards are reminding voters that in the 1987 campaign, Roemer promised no new taxes and a leaner budget. Taxes and fees have increased by \$500 million. The budget, at \$9.1 billion, has grown 34 percent. Bush will be host at a \$5,000-a-

person reception and speak at a \$1,000-a-plate dinner for the gov-

Two years ago, the president went on radio to plead with voters in a suburban New Orleans district to turn their backs on Duke, a candidate for the Legislature. Duke won.

In the 1990 U.S. Senate race, prominent Republicans gritted their teeth and backed the Democratic incumbent, Bennett Johnston, against Duke. Johnston retained his seat but Duke got 44 percent of the vote, including 60 percent of the white vote.
