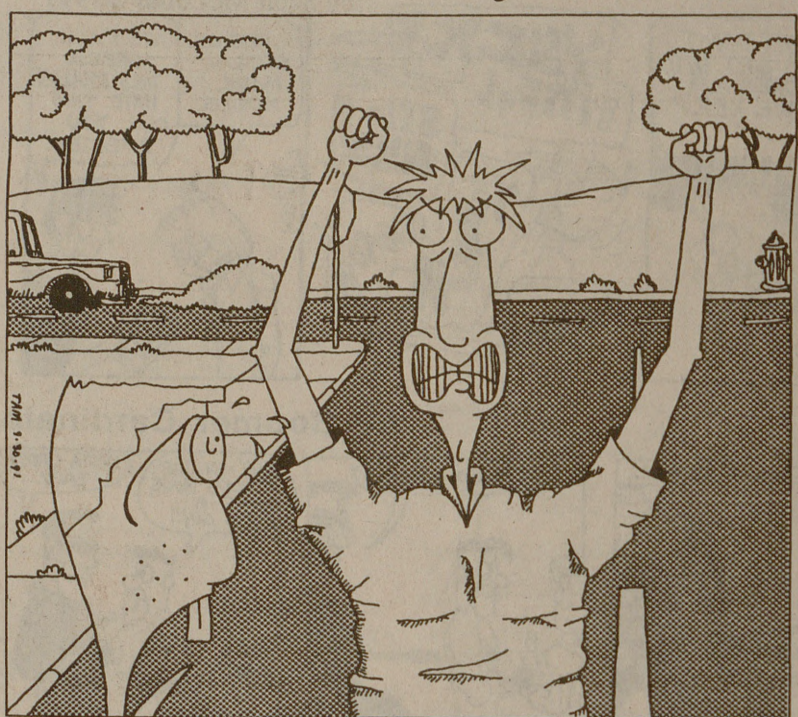

Governor Roemer awaits Bush's support

meet in a Nov. 16 runoff. Louisiana's three largest newspapers - The Times-Picayune of New Orleans, the Baton Rouge Sunday Advocate, and The Times in Shreveport - endorsed Roemer on Sunday.

Both Duke and Edwards are reminding voters that in the 1987 campaign, Roemer promised no new taxes and a leaner budget. Taxes and fees have increased by \$500 million. The budget, at \$9.1 billion, has grown 34 percent.

Bush will be host at a \$5,000-a-person reception and speak at a \$1,000-a-plate dinner for the governor.

Two years ago, the president went on radio to plead with voters in a suburban New Orleans district to turn their backs on Duke, a candidate for the Legislature. Duke won.

In the 1990 U.S. Senate race, prominent Republicans gritted their teeth and backed the Democratic incumbent, Bennett Johnston, against Duke. Johnston retained his seat but Duke got 44 percent of the vote, including 60 percent of the white vote.

"He represents a portion of the population that is a factor that cannot be dismissed," Roemer

A&M officials investigate harassment

seek the effective mechanisms for creating a climate where women are not intimidated or harassed and treated as full members of the Corps as they must be," he said.

Mobley said these kinds of delegations are not acceptable, but it is important to not indict the whole Corps, and all the men and women in it.

"Clearly there are some issues that need to be evaluated and addressed," he said. "We've got to assess what the facts are and respond promptly and appropriately based on the facts, but also be concerned about due process."

Mobley said the review committee will create the opportunity for more people to speak about discrimination and harassment issues. In the future, someone might be assigned to the Corps who is outside the regular chain of command to deal only with women's concerns.

One of the issues discussed during the meeting between Mobley and the women was that women in the Corps have no recourse when they are discriminated against because their complaints are buried within the chain of command.

"I can't say how difficult it will be to establish things as fact," Mobley said. "Some will be more difficult than others."

"I hope for everyone's sake there will be some clarity and resolution," he continued.

Bob Wiatt, director of the University Police Department, could not be reached for comment.

always seems to run into some trouble.

"UPD acted very quickly in giving us the information necessary to start tracing the calls," Mazzulo said. "They recognize that this type of behavior is a crime no matter who it is directed against, and we will definitely prosecute anyone they catch."

Mazzulo said the hotline has been very successful for the group in the past, and credits the line for a recent increase in the organization's membership.

"The hotline is a way for students to communicate with GLSS," he said. "A lot of students don't know about us. The line is a way for us to let them know when we have events and meetings coming up."

The hotline is also available for gay and lesbian students who feel they have been discriminated against, he said.

"The messages can be relayed through the president and me to the proper authorities if someone feels they have been harassed," Mazzulo said.

Reinhardt said the majority of the messages left are legitimate.

"Most callers either want information on GLSS or are trying to find support," he said. "Information on our roommate referral service is also available through the hotline number (847-0321)."

Reinhardt said the number adds a new dimension to the organization.

"We have a lot of people from around the country visit A&M from other parts of the country," he said. "They always say they can't believe there is actually a gay and lesbian organization on campus. It's really very exciting."

Calls to University police investigators were not returned.
