told the assembled delegates. U.S., Israeli and Arab officials acknowledged deep uncertainty about the next phase of the peace process — separate bilateral talks between Israel and Syria, Lebanon, and a Jordanian-Palestinian delegation.

for these talks were set, Secretary of State James A. Baker III said,

"We seek peace, real peace," Bush declared on Wednesday.

"And by real peace I mean treaties. Security. Diplomatic relations. Economic relations. Trade. Investment. Cultural Exchange. Even tourism."

Bush said, the goal "is not simply to end the state of war in the

Middle East and replace it with a state of nonbelligerency. This is not enough; this would not last,"

Bush told Shamir directly that "territorial compromise is essential for peace. Boundaries should reflect the quality of both security and political arrangements."
