Loans, the College Access Loans (CAL) for middle-income students, the Supplemental Loan for Students (SLS) and the Health Education Assistance Loans (HEAL) for students in health-related ma-

Engelage said students could go to commercial lenders, such as banks, for every loan but a CAL, but the interest rate would be higher than it would be through Hinson-Hazlewood.

"No commercial lenders offer the College Access Loans," he

Engelage said the same proposal was voted on in August and

"The proposal primarily failed because its backers assumed that because the money was for stu-dents, voters would pass it," he said, "so there wasn't a big push

Another reason it failed the first time, he said, is because of confusing wording.

Scott Sallman, a senior industrial distribution major, said he receives a College Access Loan through Hinson-Hazlewood, and

was very relieved that the funding proposition passed.

"If it weren't for the College Access Loan, I wouldn't be here," he said. "If it hadn't passed, and my other funds had run out, I don't know what I would have done.

He said his funds were guaranteed through the end of the year, but he was glad when the proposal was resubmitted for a


