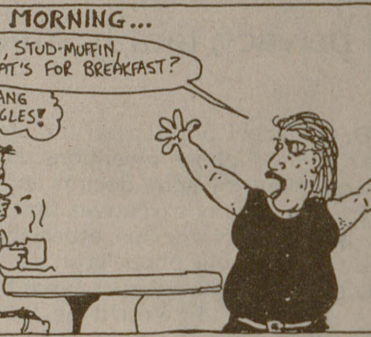

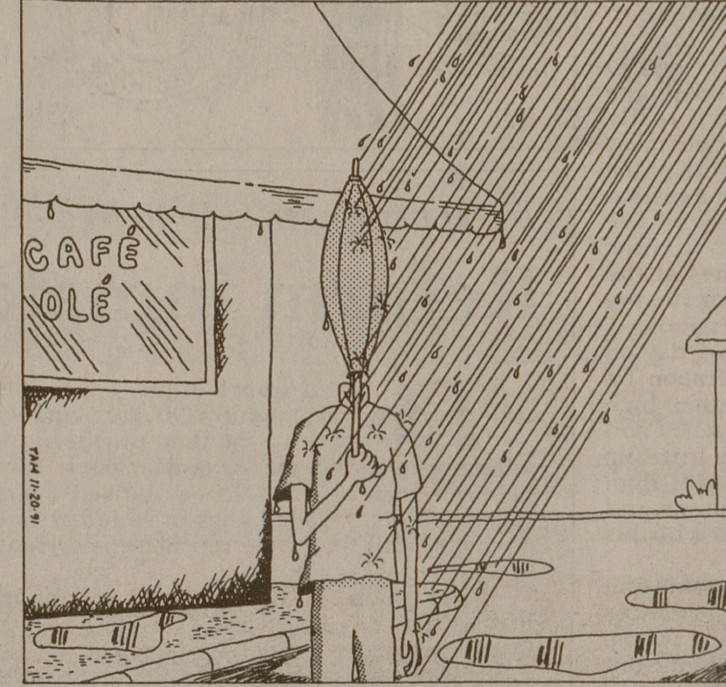

## Upset Sunday: Cowboys, Steelers, Patriots log wins

**Cowboys 24, Redskins 21**  
WASHINGTON (AP) — The Dallas Cowboys showed the Washington Redskins how hard it is to go undefeated in the NFL, holding one of the league's most potent offenses to one touchdown until the final minute for a 24-21 victory Sunday.

The Redskins, 11-1, lost an opportunity to become just the fourth team in NFL history to open a season 12-0. The Cowboys improved to 7-5, strengthening their chances for an NFC Wild Card playoff spot.

The Cowboys, who lost quarterback Troy Aikman to a sprained knee early in the third period, put the game away when backup Steve Beuerlein hit Michael Irvin, who made a juggling, one-handed catch at the Redskin 5, reversed direction and scampered past Darrell Green into the end zone, putting the Cowboys up 21-7 with 13:32 remaining.

**Steelers 26, Oilers 14**  
Just like the 1970s, the Super Bowl still doesn't come through Pittsburgh (5-7) in Houston Oilers.

Pittsburgh's defense harassed a chilled Warren Moon into committing six turnovers that reduced 16 points and one of NFL's biggest upsets of the season, a 26-14 Steelers' victory Sunday that delayed the Oilers' season title-clinching.

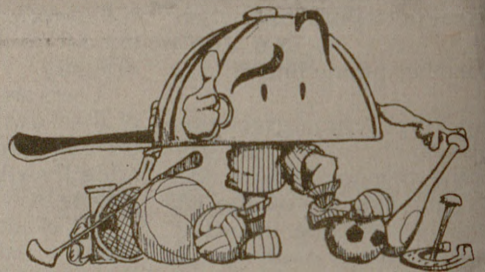
The Oilers (9-3) were trying to win their first AFC Central division title since the AFL-NFL merger in 1970, but the NFL's so-called offense never warmed up.

**Patriots 16, Bills 13**  
New England (4-8) intercepted four of Jim Kelly's passes, sacked him four times to beat Buffalo (10-2) at home.

Hugh Millen's 2-yard scamper with 13:09 left put the Patriots ahead 16-13. Millen ran New England 65 yards using huddle offense.
