an independent Palestinian state. Supported by militant Jewish settlers in the occupied lands, both parties want Israel to annex the territories, which were seized in the 1967 Middle East war. Moledet also demands the expul-sion of the 1.7 million Palestinians in the territories.

Shamir tried to reassure supporters of his right-wing Likud bloc during a television appearance Friday night, saying he in-sists on Israel retaining sovereignty over the occupied lands after a five-year period of autonomy.

Appearing on the same show, Shimon Peres, head of the Labor

Party, called for Israel to withdraw from the territories after the interim autonomy period. He said that should be followed by a confederation between Jordan and the Palestinian areas.

With polls saying most Israelis support the peace talks, Shamir said he expected to go forward in the negotiations before the elections. But a caretaker government would not have a mandate to make far-reaching decisions on peace.



murder of John F. Kennedy, bu the chairman of the former House assassinations committee predic ed the records will not produc new evidence.

'The files don't contain information that alters publicly dis closed information," Rep. Louis Stokes, D-Ohio, said in an interview. "Those contending there's something in those records that

covers up something will be abysmally disappointed." Stokes said last week that hes exploring "the possibility of a re-olution that would authorize release" of the files.

The pressure to open the file followed release of Oliver Stone's movie "JFK," which suggested that Kennedy was the victim of a conspiracy when he was shotin Dallas on Nov. 22, 1963.

The assassination committee led by Stokes, concluded in 1979 that Kennedy was the victim of a probable conspiracy that could have involved organized crime figures

Others publicly supporting release of the files include former President Gerald Ford, a memb of the Warren Commission that investigated the assassinatio Rep. Lee Hamilton, D-Ind.; Senat Majority Leader George Mitche D-Maine; and former FBI and Cl director William Webster.

I had not seen anything that could not be released on nationa security grounds," Webster said.

A spokeswoman for Sen. Ed ward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., sai the family would not oppose re lease of the files.

"The family has no control over any of these files," said Melody Miller. "They prefer to stay out of that debate. But they have not stood in the way of any investigation in the past nor would they in the future. It's just too painful to get involved."

The assassination committee's final report concluded that John Kennedy was the victim of a probable murder conspiracy.
