"It's quite different now. 'Cycling is still perceived as an international sport and it is. It's just not a mainstream American

forward in cycling in the Western Hemisphere," Simes said. "We now have our own calendar of international events between North and South America that will score points (toward World Cup stand-

ing)."
That means our teams no longer have to go to Europe to score points. They can race here." Lynn Pettyjohn, manager of the Coors Light racing team, sees things a little differently.

The influence will be minimal at best," Pettyjohn said. "The amount of points you can score in the United States are minuscule relative to Europe. About 85 percent of the points are in Europe.

"The addition of races over here just means that some of the bigger races the Europeans can come over and get points here.




