


Bird's return marks Dallas' demise, 101-91

BOSTON (AP) — Larry Bird had 26 points, 13 rebounds and nine assists in a spectacular return from a two-month layoff, leading the Boston Celtics to a 101-91 victory over the Dallas Mavericks on

Sunday night. Sidelined with an inflamed nerve in the lower back since Dec. 30, Bird played 34 minutes, in-cluding the entire third period, hitting nine of 16 field-goal at-

tempts and all seven of his free throw attempts.

The 35-year-old veteran took charge in the third period, spark-ing the Celtics to just their fourth victory in 12 games. He had seven points, seven rebounds and five assists in the quarter, then re-turned briefly in the final period, narrowly missing his first tripledouble

Boston broke away from a 59-

59 tie in the decisive third period, outscoring the Mavericks 19-9 to take a a 78-68 advantage into the final quarter.

Given a standing ovation when introduced, Bird threw up a brick on his first shot from 18 feet, but quickly settled down. He scored seven points, including a 3-pointer, while playing eight min-utes and helping Boston to a 21-21 first period tie.
