**Lady Aggies
have trouble
in Invitational**

The Texas A&M softball team lost three of nine games this weekend and tied for seventh place in the Aggie Invitational I.

The 10th-ranked Lady Aggies, struggled Sunday, losing all three games. A&M, 11-10 this season, was defeated by Nebraska 1-0 in nine innings. Louisiana Tech surprised the Aggies 3-0, and Northern Illinois upset A&M 2-1 in the final game of the three-day tournament.

South Carolina beat all the right teams and won the tournament with a 7-2 record.

Minnesota finished with a 7-1 record but had to cancel one game because of travel plans. Missouri also ended the tourney with a 7-2 record.

South Carolina grabbed the championship by defeating Minnesota and Missouri.

A&M softball coach Bob Brock said the Lady Aggies lacked of-

fense during the Invitational.

"We just did not score any runs this weekend," Brock said. "Like I've said before, if you can't hit you are going to have a tough time."

In the final game Sunday, Northern Illinois scored single runs in the sixth and seventh innings to overcome a 1-0 A&M lead.

The Lady Aggies loaded the bases with three straight singles the bottom of the ninth inning.

With one out, Tammie Dechuk's grounder was thrown home to force Dawn Wuthrich, Sharla Cannon, A&M's next batter, lined out to left field to end the game.

Baylor takes two of three games from A&M

A&M is now 13-5 on the season, and the two losses were the first for the Aggies in 11 home games.

After winning the opening game of the series, 7-6, in extra innings, the Aggies couldn't get a run across against Baylor starter Frank Foltyn in a 4-0 loss in the first game of the twinbill.

In the final game of the series, A&M held a 6-1 lead after six innings of play, but the Bears managed to score three runs in both the seventh and eighth innings to steal a 7-6 win and the series victory.

The winning run was scored in the top of the eighth when Baylor leftfielder Jahn Finke, who reached base on a walk, stole third base and went home after A&M catcher Rob Trimble's throw went into leftfield.

Senior Brian Harrison, now 2-1 on the season, was the losing pitcher in Saturday's first game.

Sophomore Kelly Wunsch started the final game and held the Bears to only one run through six innings. After loading the bases in the seventh, Wunsch was relieved by James Nix, who finished the game as the losing pitcher and dropped his record to 4-3.

Johnson said the Aggies still have an opportunity to make their move in the conference race because of the new format of the SWC season.

"It's still real early in the year," he said. "You don't like to lose any games at home, but Baylor

played well and you've got to give them a lot of credit. Their pitchers didn't give us anything and we had a lot of balls right at them, and sometimes those balls and sometimes they don't.

"This was a tough three-game series, and we just got to regroup and get ready for Texas Tech next weekend," Johnson said.

In the first game of the series, sophomore pitcher Granger pitched 8 2/3 innings and recorded three strikeouts, his career high at A&M, but left the game without a decision.

In the top of the ninth inning, with the game tied at 5, two Baylor runners reached base with two outs and Johnson called on Nix to replace Granger.

The first batter Nix faced singled to left field to give the Bears a 6-5 lead.

A&M designated hitter Billy Harlan then singled in a run in the bottom of the inning to tie the score at 6 and send the game into extra innings.

In the bottom of the tenth inning, Aggie shortstop Jason Marshall, the team's leading hitter with a .400 batting average, singled in the winning run to give A&M the 7-6 victory.

Granger said although he achieved his career high in strikeouts Friday night, it was tough to get the bench and not get the win.

"It's always tough when you do all that work and get nothing, but I had two bad innings and really didn't deserve to win," Granger said. "I pitched pretty good, but it wasn't good enough to win. I have to give James Nix credit and give the offense credit for coming back to win the game."

crowds with his enthusiasm, sat quietly on the bench with his coat and tie still on. It was that bad.

It was so bad that after a Corey Henderson free throw cut the score to 42-19, one press table philosopher quipped, "Hey, three more touchdowns, and we're back in this thing!"

It was so bad that with two minutes left in the game, the Longhorn band (who only know one song) all held up their car keys and dangled them, shouting, "Go start your tractors! Go start your tractors!"

It was so bad that Texas head coach Tom Penders put his son, Tommy, in the game. Tommy gets about as much playing time as Darrell Royal.

But not only did he get a basket off an offensive rebound, but he made a Globetrotter-like behind-the-back pass to Benford

Williams on the next possession to put Texas up by 33.

His glowing father, in the postgame press conference, joked, "I think he's right up there with Kenny Anderson."

Tommy received a standing ovation when he exited the game in the last couple of minutes. A good sign that things aren't going your way is when the bench warmers are taken out to get some rest.

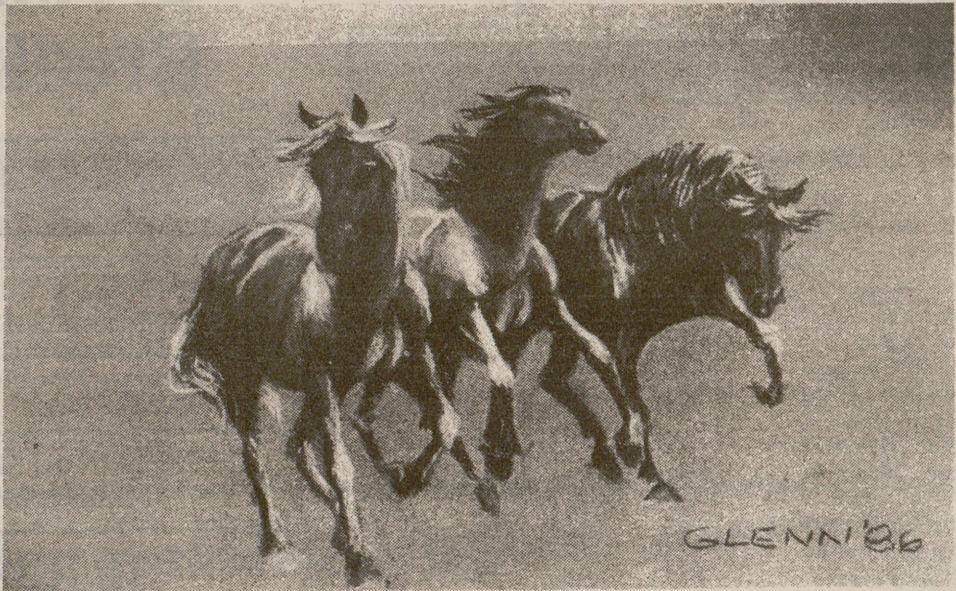

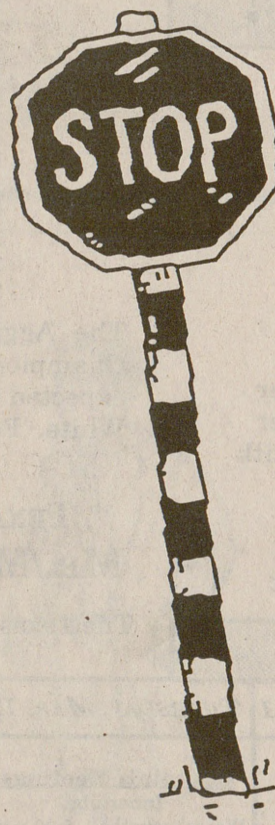
