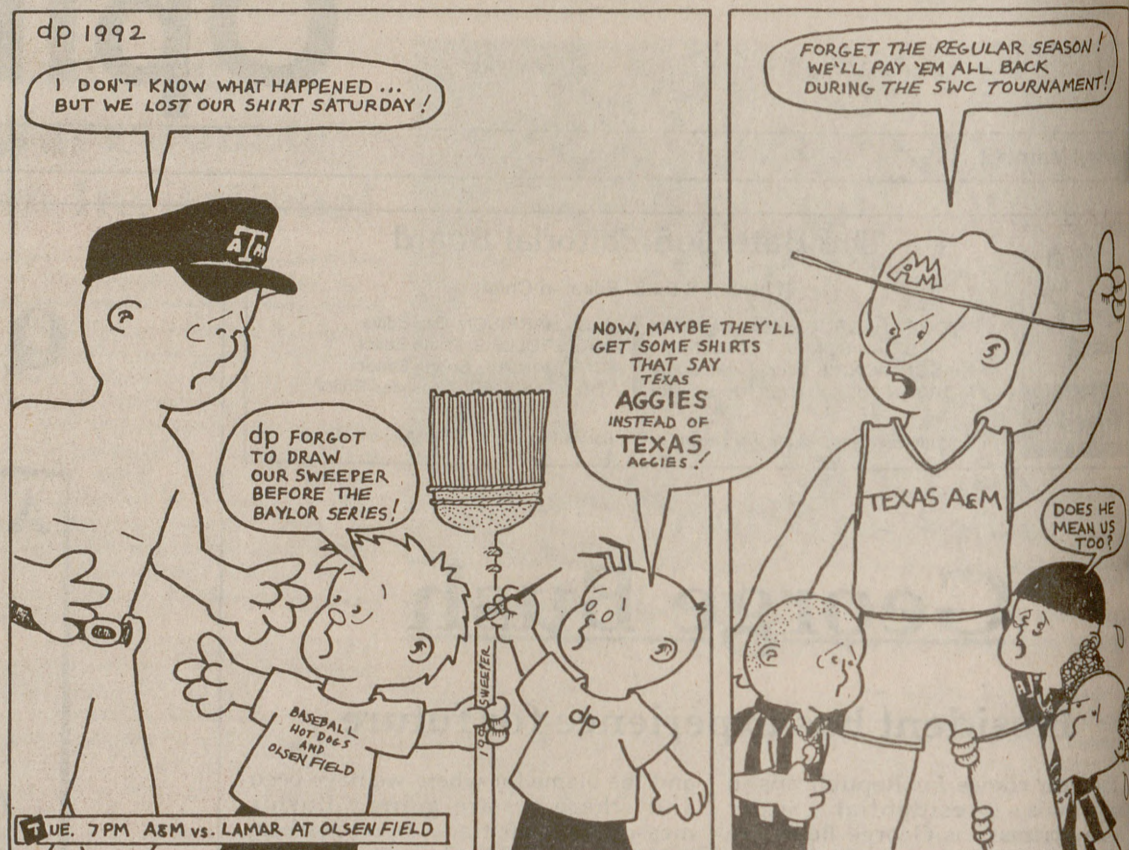

combat Texas' press made it difficult for them to get any momentum generated.

"We were real tentative against the press," he said. "We didn't turn it over as many times as I felt we did in the first half, but we never attacked it. You're taking away something that should be an advantage, which is attacking the press."

Texas could do no wrong on offense, either. They shot 57 percent from the floor and 67 percent from the free throw line.

The Aggies hit only 41 percent of their shots and converted a mere 22 percent from three-point range.

Five Longhorns were in double figures. Tyler had 16 points, including four three-point shots. Burditt had 15, Terrence Rencher picked up 13, and Benford Williams scored 10.

A&M and Texas meet again Friday in the first round of the SWC tournament in Dallas' Reunion Arena at 7:00 p.m.

Barone said he looks for improvement in the rematch.

"I think you can look at it as a problem, or you can look at it as a challenge.

"I'm going to take it as a challenge and try to come up with a game plan that might change the style of play and tempo of play."

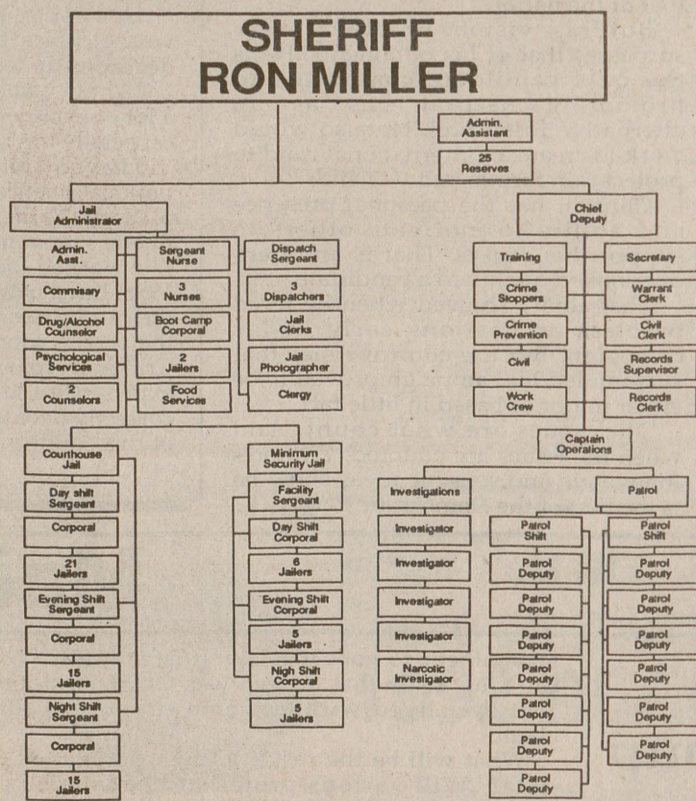
