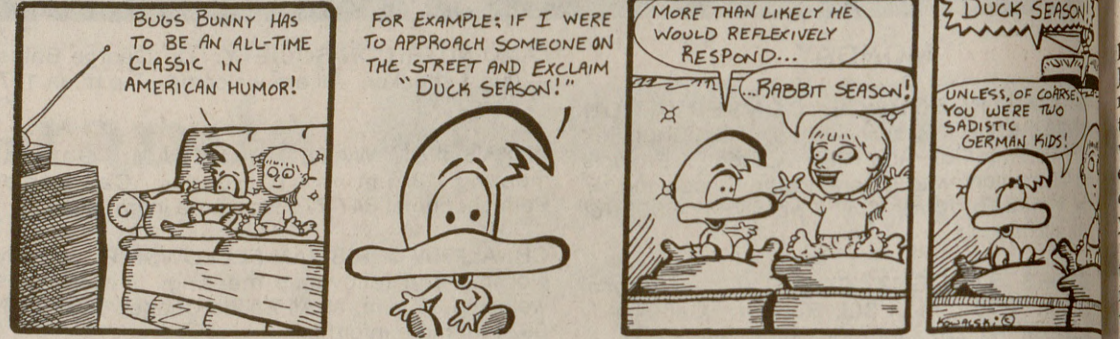

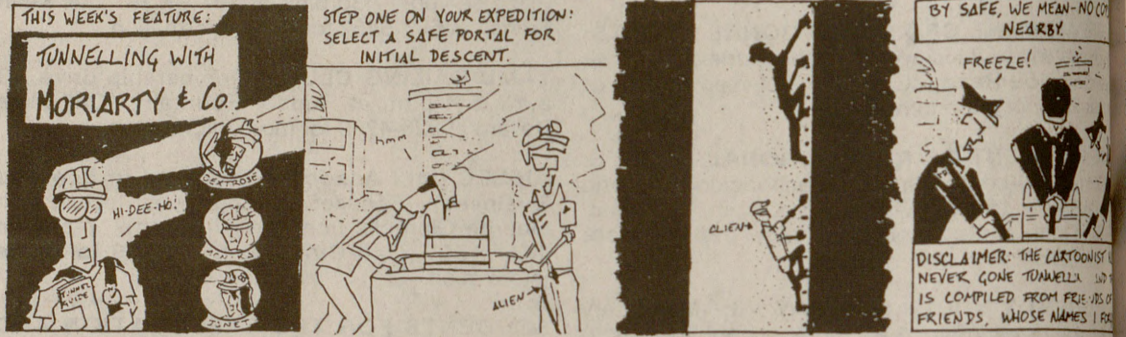

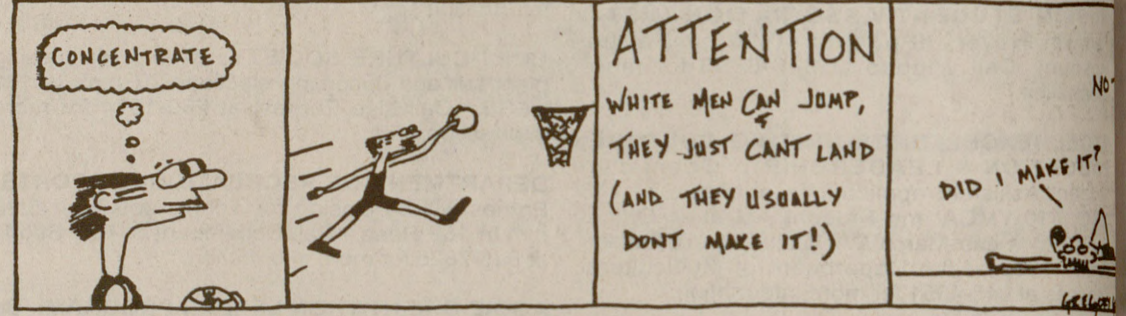

## Topless bars expect boon at national convention

HOUSTON (AP) — Top-scale topless nightclubs are banking on a boom in business this August when the Republican National Convention brings 40,000 people to the city.

"We're putting together an unbelievable packet to hand out to people personally at the hotels and down at the convention," said Bill Floyd, general manager of Rick's Cabaret, a club that derives its name from the movie "Casablanca" and caters to an upscale audience.

"We figure the VIP room is going to be a premium during that two-week period," he said.

The convention will be held Aug. 17-20 in the Astrodome, with platform hearings scheduled for the week before.

"It's certainly not something that we're going to encourage," said Republican National Committee spokesman Gary Koops.

"They certainly aren't working with us, and we have no intention of working with them."

Asked if clubs would be allowed to sell suggestive T-shirts from concession booths at the Astrodome — as one is trying to do — Koops laughed, saying that possibility ranked in the "zero and nil" category.

## Democrat will issue plan for drug summit

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — A key congressman will ask President Bush to follow up last month's international drug summit in San Antonio with a domestic version.

Rep. Charles Rangel, a New York Democrat who chairs the House Select Committee on Narcotics Abuse and Control, plans to announce the proposal Monday, the San Antonio Light reports Sunday.

"The summit format seemed to work for discussing international drug strategies in Cartagena in 1990, and in San Antonio a few weeks ago," Rangel said. "There is absolutely no reason we cannot transfer that same strategy to the drug fight here at home."

Rangel also plans to release a study on the societal costs of crime, drugs and violence.

"We really have yet to make any noticeable gains in reducing serious and addictive drug use at home," he said in a letter to Bush.

Rangel suggested Bush invite his Cabinet members and experts from the fields of criminal justice, health care, religion, education, drug treatment and prevention, and community and economic development.

"I know that this is the campaign season and many events and remarks are viewed as politically motivated," Rangel said in the letter.

"Yet, I trust that the American people... would look at this attention by you as nothing short of a presidential response to a serious and tragic menace that we cannot allow to become lost in the shadows of our economic crisis."

A White House spokesman said his office would not comment on Rangel's proposal until Bush receives the letter and reacts to it personally.

"It's vital to get grass-roots agencies and law enforcement involved," said Melody R. Jones, president of a social service organization called Reaching the Youth of San Antonio. "They should have done this before the international summit."

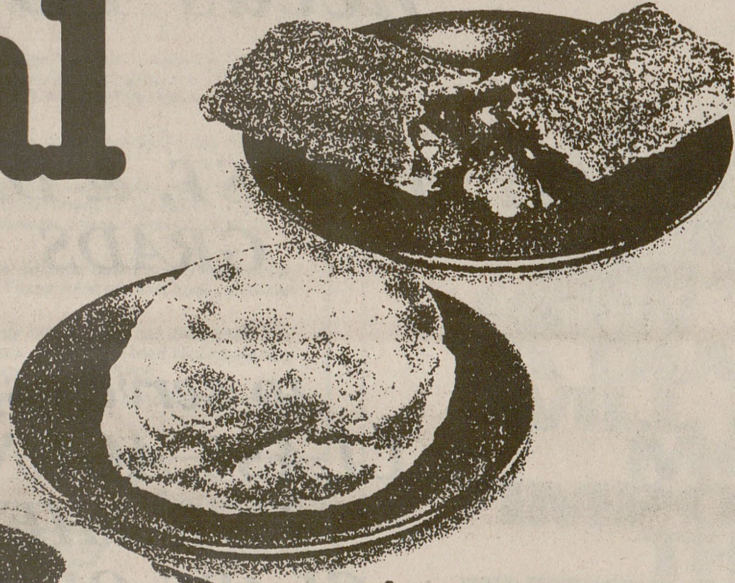
But Bexar County District Attorney Steve Hilbig was skeptical, saying resources should focus on prosecution, education and treatment.
