U.N. awaits surrender of Libyans

UNITED NATIONS (AP) — Arab League envoys flew to Libya on Tuesday to meet Col. Moammar Gadhafi and try to work out the surrender of the two Libyan suspects in the Pan Am Flight 103 bombing.

The Security Council's president said he expected swift delivery of the two Libyans for trial in the United States or Britain. The United States contended Libya was only stalling.

The Arab League group that went to Libya consisted of league secretary-general Esmat Abdel-Maguid of Egypt and envoys from Syria, Libya, Egypt, Tunisia, Algeria, Morocco and Mauritania.

Libya offered on Monday to turn the suspects over to the Arab League. Its plan was an attempt to avoid a new Security Council resolution imposing an arms embargo, cutting off its air routes and urging other countries to eject most Libyan diplomats.

The offer won Libya a brief respite from council action, diplomats said.

U.S. Ambassador Thomas R. Pickering said he will renew his push to have the council adopt the resolution by the end of the week if the Libyans are not extradited. He said the Libyan offer "seems to be more of a stall than a compliance."

He said Libya still has to comply with the French request, provide all the evidence it has on the bombings, end its support of terrorism and promise to compensate the families of victims.

At the White House, press secretary Marlin Fitzwater said Tuesday that "We still think the case should be prosecuted under the judicial procedures we set up in our original indictment."

Asked whether there are any positive benefits to Libya's offer, Fitzwater said "At the moment it's questionable."

Diplomats stressed Tuesday they had no news of the surrender of the two suspects, Abdel Basset Ali Megrahi, 39 and Lamen Khalifa Fhimah, 35. They also said there had been no written confirmation from Libya that it would turn the men over, as Libya's U.N. ambassador pledged Monday.

"Today is an important day," said the Security Council president, Diego Arria, who is also Venezuelan ambassador. "Yesterday, we got information that would be delivered today (Tuesday) from the Arab League representative."

He added, "I don't know the shape or form the delivery will take, if it takes effect."

Arria and the French ambassador told reporters they expected the Arab League delegation would take custody of the men.

The United States and Britain seek extradition of the two for the 1988 bombing. A total of 41 people died in the attacks.

Teen finds baby, slain woman

HOUSTON (AP) — A baby was found Tuesday crying and clutching the nude body of a woman whose throat had been slashed and index finger chopped off, police said.

Police spokeswoman Sharon Thornton said the body of the unidentified Hispanic woman was found lying on the porch of an abandoned building about 7 a.m. Investigators had not yet determined if she was the baby's mother.

A teen-ager on her way to school told police she heard the baby crying and checked the area, which is across the street from an elementary school in northeast Houston.

The baby, clad only in a diaper, was believed to be about a year old. She had some scratches on her face, but was listed in fair condition Tuesday at Texas Children's Hospital.

"It does not appear she was injured," Thornton said. "She did have blood on her, but we heard she was fine. She apparently had just been playing."

Police were questioning a white man who fled the area in a car, but Thornton said there have been no charges filed in the case.

"He did have some blood on him, but no one has been charged," she said.

Rachel Navarro, who lives in the area, said the incident did not surprise her because of a growing crime problem in the area.

"Everyday there's something like this happening in this area," she said.

Police believe the woman's body was dumped in the area since she was not known to residents in the neighborhood. A bloodstained car also was found in the area.

Fire erupts in Jordanian hotel during holy banquet

AMMAN, Jordan (AP) — A fire broke out last night during a Ramadan banquet at the International Hotel, stranding guests on the upper floors.

Some people could be seen standing on balconies, burning candles so rescue workers could see them.

As firefighters struggled to put out the blaze, dozens of injured people were receiving emergency treatment in front of the hotel, which is across the street from the U.S. Embassy.

Suhel Jabra, a desk clerk at the hotel, said the entire basement was burning. He said it appeared the fire started from an electrical failure.

Officials said the blaze began about 7 p.m. in a tent set up for the banquet, where dozens of people were gathered for the Muslim holy month of Ramadan, an evening feast after the day of fasting.

"I don't think this is a sabotage attempt," said Nicholas Wemieger, a Dutch national who is the hotel's executive general manager.

Hotel officials said there were 36 guests in the 225-room hotel, excluding hotel employees and banquet guests.

S. Korean governing party stumbles

SEOUL, South Korea (AP) — President Roh Tae-woo's governing party may lose its parliamentary majority in balloting today, KSB television said.

The vote was seen as a referendum on Roh's conservative government, which opponents charge with economic mismanagement and slow democratic reforms.

With more than 50 percent of the votes counted, Democratic Liberal Party candidates were leading in 117 of the 237 districts — two seats short of a majority in the National Assembly, KBS said.

Candidates from Kim Dae-jung's main opposition party were ahead in 77 districts and millionaire businessman Chung Ju-yung's new party had 20 candidates winning, the television report said.

"Whether the ruling party would take a parliamentary majority has been thrown into doubt," the national news agency Yonhap said.

Early returns had shown Roh's party leading in 138 of the single-member districts.

Roh cannot be re-elected when

his term runs out in February, but his party had hoped to win enough seats to keep its current majority into this fall's presidential race.

A total of 1,048 candidates were vying for 237 seats to be decided by direct vote today.

In addition, 62 seats were to be filled by national nominees based on each party's percentage of votes.

Election officials said at least 70.8 percent of the 29 million eligible voters cast ballots, the lowest turnout for a general election in Korean history.

In the past, a lighter turnout has tended to help the governing party.

NTSB links de-icing fluid to jet crash

Cold-weather protectant lasts only five minutes, experts say

NEW YORK (AP) — The de-icing fluid used on a USAir jet half an hour before it crashed in a snowstorm normally protects against ice for just five minutes, experts said Tuesday.

The pilot, who was among the 27 people killed in Sunday night's crash, had the plane de-iced with a fluid known as Type 1 about 35 minutes before takeoff.

"The fluids that would be used at La Guardia or by USAir just won't last that long," said Richard Adams, a retired Federal Aviation Administration official whose expertise is aircraft icing.

"In a snowstorm similar to La Guardia,

where the snow was falling at about 1.5 inches an hour, probably the fluid would not have lasted and it would have had to be re-de-iced," agreed Gary Bradley, who chairs a professional engineering committee on aircraft icing.

Another cold-weather protectant for airplanes, known as Type 2, prevents the formation of ice for at least 30 minutes.

National Transportation Safety Board investigators said de-icing was one of many factors they were looking at as a cause of the crash.

Twenty-four people survived the crash of Flight 405. The plane crashed at the end of the runway during takeoff and skidded into Flush-

ing Bay.

The medical examiner's office said Tuesday that 18 people died of drowning. Four died from head or torso injuries suffered during impact and four from thermal or burn injuries, said spokeswoman Ellen Borakove. One victim had burns, blunt impact and thermal injuries.

At the airport Tuesday, flatbed trucks carried pieces of the Fokker 28 jet to Hangar 1, where three dozen people analyzed the pieces.

There were many crushed, mangled, charred bits, plus four recognizable pieces in front of the fuselage, including the cockpit, four-seat first-class section and a row of coach seats; one wing; the tail; and an engine.
