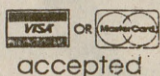

pact workout to raise money for the MDA.

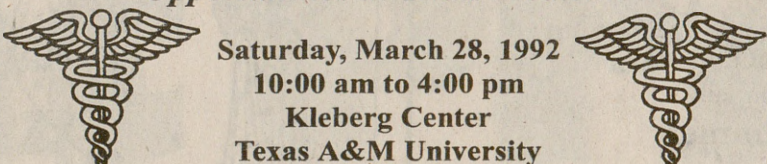

The Bud Light concert series at the event will feature Touch-n-Go Jeff Boys and Cold 45. Martin Delray will also perform at the event.

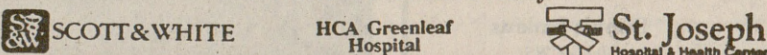
