





His songs range from lonesome cowboy tales like "If I Had a Boat" in which Tonto informs the Lone Ranger, 'Kemo sabe, kiss my ass" and then floats away in solitude, and sultry blues numbers like "Here I Am" and "Crying Shame."

Robert Earl Keen, Jr., who will perform at Stafford Opera House Friday night, also considers himself to be a country singer, but, like Lovett, doesn't fit the traditional country sound. Keen is a master storyteller and brings a folksy, Texas sound to the Opera House.

Both Lovett and Keen are worth the ticket price of \$10 (available at the MSC box office and Marooned Records, respectively). Their fresh approach to songwriting will leave you anxious for even more, making new albums to be released by each this year well worth the wait.
